A BILL

To reprogram \$15,000,000 in savings in the Jackson Barracks military construction to the Department of the Interior for the Historic Preservation Fund of the National Park Service for the purpose of restoring Jackson Barracks to its pre-Hurricane Katrina status as a national historic treasure.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. REPROGRAMMING OF FUNDS FOR RESTORA-
- 4 TION OF JACKSON BARRACKS, LOUISIANA.
- 5 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-
- 6 ings:

- 1 (1) Devastation from Hurricane Katrina in 2 2006 touched every structure at Jackson Barracks, 3 also causing extensive damage to historic Jackson 4 Barracks, which were constructed between 1834 and 5 1835 and consisted of 14 Antebellum Garrison 6 Structures.
 - (2) Jackson Barracks requires additional renovations and restorations that are not within the scope of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which has been obligated to assist in funding hurricane related damages only.
 - (3) There is a pressing need to complete non-FEMA subsidized restoration and renovation of the historic structures at Jackson Barracks while concurrently performing hurricane related repairs.
 - (4) The Chief of the National Guard Bureau has agreed to reprogram this \$15,000,000 savings to the Department of the Interior for the Historic Preservation Fund of the National Park Service to assist in the completion of historic preservation at Jackson Barracks, and Secretary of the Interior Dirk Kempthorne has agreed to that allocation of funds.

- 7 \$2,600,000 to the Department of the Interior for the pur-

- 9 (2) Of the amount appropriated or otherwise made
- 10 available by such Act under such heading and available
- 11 for a Readiness Center at Jackson Barracks, Louisiana,
- 12 the Secretary of the Army shall transfer \$1,750,000 to
- 13 the Department of the Interior for the purpose set forth
- 14 in subsection (c).
- 15 (3) Of the amount appropriated or otherwise made
- 16 available by such Act under such heading and available
- 17 for a Readiness Center at Hammond, Louisiana, the Sec-
- 18 retary of the Army shall transfer \$2,650,000 to the De-
- 19 partment of the Interior for the purpose set forth in sub-
- 20 section (c).
- 21 (4) Of the amount appropriated or otherwise made
- 22 available by such Act under such heading and available
- 23 for planning and design for various projects, the Secretary
- 24 of the Army shall transfer \$8,000,000 to the Department
- 25 of the Interior for the purpose set forth in subsection (c).

- 1 (c) Use of Reprogrammed Funds.—Amounts
- 2 transferred to the Department of the Interior pursuant
- 3 to subsection (b) shall be allocated to the Historic Preser-
- 4 vation Fund of the National Park Service, to remain avail-
- 5 able until expended, for the purpose of restoration, reha-
- 6 bilitation, and historic preservation activities at Jackson
