A BILL

To rescind unexpended Iraq reconstruction funds.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	$tives\ of\ the\ United\ States\ of\ America\ in\ Congress\ assembled,$
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Rescission of
5	Unneeded Iraq Reconstruction Funds Act of 2008".
6	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
7	Congress finds that—
8	(1) Iraq has abundant financial resources to
9	fund relief and reconstruction projects;
10	(2)(A) in November 2007, the Government of
11	Iraq estimated that oil income in 2008 would

amount to \$35,000,000,000; but

1	(B) with high crude oil prices and Iraq oil pro-
2	duction at record levels, the Special Inspector Gen-
3	eral for Iraq estimates that oil revenues could exceed
4	\$70,000,000,000;
5	(3) Iraqi Deputy Prime Minister Barham Salih
6	stated recently that "Iraq does not need financial as-
7	sistance.";
8	(4) the Government Accountability Office esti-
9	mates that the Government of Iraq—
10	(A) has accumulated a budget surplus of
11	approximately \$29,000,000,000 from fiscal year
12	2005 through 2007; and
13	(B) will accumulate a budget surplus of
14	between \$38,200,000,000 and \$50,300,000,000
15	for fiscal year 2008; and
16	(5) according to the July 2008 quarterly report
17	of the Special Inspector General for Iraq—
18	(A) Congress has appropriated
19	\$43,560,000,000 for the major United States
20	reconstruction accounts in Iraq; but
21	(B) over $\frac{1}{4}$ of those funds, or
22	\$12,570,000,000, have not yet been expended,
23	including unobligated funds from appropria-
24	tions for prior fiscal years.

SEC. 3. RESCISSION OF UNEXPENDED IRAQ RECONSTRUC TION FUNDS. There are rescinded any amounts that remain unex pended as of the date of enactment of this Act in— (1) the Iraq Relief and Reconstruction Fund;

(2) the Iraq Security Forces Fund; and

7 (3) the Economic Support Fund authorized 8 under chapter 4 of part II of the Foreign Assistance 9 Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2346 et seq.) that are avail-

able for Iraq.
