Mr. Lautenberg (for himself, Mr. Menendez, Mr. Kerry, and Mr. Biden) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

## A BILL

To provide for disclosure of fire safety standards and measures with respect to campus buildings, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Campus Fire Safety
- 5 Right-to-Know Act of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY OF CAMPUS BUILD-
- 7 INGS.
- 8 Section 485 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
- 9 U.S.C. 1092) is amended—

1	(1) in subsection $(a)(1)$ —
2	(A) by striking "and" at the end of sub-
3	paragraph (N);
4	(B) by striking the period at the end of
5	subparagraph (O) and inserting "; and; and
6	(C) by adding at the end the following new
7	subparagraph:
8	"(P) the fire safety report prepared by the in-
9	stitution pursuant to subsection (h)."; and
10	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
11	section:
12	"(h) DISCLOSURE OF FIRE SAFETY STANDARDS AND
13	Measures.—
14	"(1) Annual fire safety reports re-
15	QUIRED.—Each eligible institution participating in
16	any program under this title shall, beginning in the
17	first academic year that begins after the date of en-
18	actment of the Campus Fire Safety Right-to-Know
19	Act of 2007, and each year thereafter—
20	"(A) prepare, publish, and distribute,
21	through appropriate publications (including the
22	Internet) or mailings, to all current students
23	and employees, and to any applicant for enroll-
24	ment or employment upon request, an annual
25	fire safety report, which shall contain informa-

1	tion with respect to the campus fire safety prac-
2	tices and standards of that institution, includ-
3	ing—
4	"(i) a statement that identifies each
5	student housing facility owned or con-
6	trolled by the institution, and whether each
7	such facility is equipped with a full fire
8	sprinkler system or other fire safety sys-
9	tems, fire escape planning or protocols, or
10	both;
11	"(ii) statistics for each student hous-
12	ing facility concerning the occurrence of
13	fires and unwanted and false alarms in
14	each such facility, during the 2 preceding
15	calendar years for which data are avail-
16	able;
17	"(iii) for each such occurrence in fa-
18	cilities described in clauses (i) and (ii), a
19	summary of the human injuries or deaths,
20	structural and property damage, or com-
21	bination thereof;
22	"(iv) information regarding rules on
23	portable electrical appliances, smoking and
24	open flames (such as candles), regular
25	mandatory supervised fire drills, and

1	planned and future improvements in fire
2	safety; and
3	"(v) information about fire safety edu-
4	cation and training provided to students,
5	faculty, and staff; and
6	"(B) submit to the Secretary a copy of the
7	statistics required to be made available under
8	subparagraph (A)(ii).
9	"(2) Fraternities, sororities, and other
10	STUDENT GROUPS THAT OWN, CONTROL, OR OCCUPY
11	HOUSING FACILITIES.—
12	"(A) Reports by organizing bodies.—
13	Each institution participating in a program
14	under this title shall, as a condition of recog-
15	nizing and permitting the operation of any fra-
16	ternity, sorority, or other student group that is
17	recognized by the institution and that owns,
18	controls, or occupies student housing facilities,
19	require the national organizing body of such
20	fraternity, sorority, or other student group, be-
21	ginning in the first academic year that begins
22	after the date of enactment of the Campus Fire
23	Safety Right-to-Know Act of 2007, and each
24	vear thereafter—

1	"(i) to collect the information de-
2	scribed in subparagraph (A), for each
3	building and property that contains stu-
4	dent housing facilities and that is owned,
5	controlled, or occupied by the fraternity,
6	sorority, or group, respectively;
7	"(ii) beginning in the first academic
8	year that begins after the date of enact-
9	ment of the Campus Fire Safety Right-to-
10	Know Act of 2007, and each year there-
11	after, to prepare, publish, and distribute,
12	through appropriate publications (including
13	the Internet) or mailings to all current
14	members, and to any interested party upon
15	request, an annual fire safety report in ac-
16	cordance with subparagraph (B) of this
17	paragraph; and
18	"(iii) to submit to the Secretary a
19	copy of the statistics described in para-
20	graph (1)(A)(ii) and required to be col-
21	lected under clause (i) of this subpara-
22	graph.
23	"(B) Contents of annual reports.—
24	The annual fire safety reports required under

1 subparagraph (A)(ii) of this paragraph shall 2 contain the following:

> "(i) Information concerning fire safety at any student housing facilities owned or controlled by the recognized fraternity, sorority, or other student group required to be collected under subparagraph (A)(i) of this paragraph.

> "(ii) A statement concerning whether and how the recognized fraternity, sorority, or other student group owning, controlling, or occupying student housing facilities works with hosting academic institutions to make buildings and property owned or controlled by such fraternities, sororities, or student groups more fire safe.

"(3) Current information to campus community.—Each institution participating in any program under this title shall make, keep, and maintain a log, written in a form that can be easily understood, recording all on-campus fires, including the nature, date, time, and general location of each fire and all unwanted and false fire alarms. All entries that are required pursuant to this paragraph shall, except where disclosure of such information is pro-

1	hibited by law, be open to public inspection, and
2	each such institution shall make annual reports to
3	the campus community on such fires and unwanted
4	and false fire alarms in a manner that will aid the
5	prevention of similar occurrences.
6	"(4) Responsibilities of the secretary.—
7	The Secretary shall—
8	"(A) review the statistics submitted under
9	paragraph (1)(B) and paragraph (2)(A)(iii);
10	"(B) make such statistics submitted to the
11	Secretary available to the public; and
12	"(C) in coordination with nationally recog-
13	nized fire organizations and representatives of
14	institutions of higher education, identify exem-
15	plary fire safety policies, procedures, programs,
16	and practices and disseminate information to
17	the Administrator of the United States Fire
18	Administration and make available to the public
19	information concerning those policies, proce-
20	dures, programs, and practices that have prov-
21	en effective in the reduction of campus fires.
22	"(5) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in
23	this subsection shall be construed to authorize the
24	Secretary to require particular policies, procedures,

programs, or practices by institutions of higher edu-

- cation with respect to fire safety, other than with respect to the collection, reporting, and dissemination of information required by this subsection.
- 4 "(6) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection, the 5 term 'campus' has the meaning provided in sub-6 section (f)(6).".

#### 7 SEC. 3. REPORT TO CONGRESS BY SECRETARY OF EDU-

- 8 CATION.
- 9 Not later than two years after the date of enactment 10 of this Act, the Secretary of Education shall prepare and 11 submit to Congress a report containing—
- (1) an analysis of the status of fire safety systems in institutions of higher education (as that term is defined in section 102 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002)), including sprinkler systems;
  - (2) an analysis of the appropriate fire safety standards to apply to these facilities, which the Secretary shall prepare after consultation with such fire safety experts, representatives of institutions of higher education, and other Federal agencies as the Secretary, in the Secretary's discretion, considers appropriate;

- (3) an estimate of the cost of bringing all nonconforming student housing facilities up to the building codes in effect at the time of the report;
  - (4) recommendations from the Secretary concerning the best means of meeting fire safety standards in all institutions of higher education, including recommendations for methods to fund the cost described in paragraph (3); and
  - (5) examples of exemplary fire safety education and training programs at institutions of higher education and recommendations for wide adoption of similar programs among institutions of higher education.
