A BILL

To authorize funding for the National Crime Victim Law Institute to provide support for victims of crime under Crime Victims Legal Assistance Programs as a part of the Victims of Crime Act of 1984.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REAUTHORIZATION.**

4 Section 103(b) of the Justice for All Act of 2004
5 (Public Law 108–405; 118 Stat. 2264) is amended—

6 (1) by striking paragraph (1) and inserting the
7 following:

1 “(1) \$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2010,
2 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014 to the Office for Vic-
3 tims of Crime of the Department of Justice for
4 United States Attorneys Offices for Victim/Wit-
5 nesses Assistance Programs only for victim advo-
6 cates and their administrative support to provide di-
7 rect services to victims of crimes;” and

8 (2) by striking paragraphs (3) and (4) and in-
9 serting the following:

10 “(3) \$500,000 for each of the fiscal years 2010,
11 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014 to the Office for Vic-
12 tims of Crime of the Department of Justice for staff
13 to administer the appropriation for the support of
14 organizations as designated under paragraph (4);

15 “(4) \$11,000,000 for each of the fiscal years
16 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014, to the Office for
17 Victims of Crime of the Department of Justice, for
18 the National Crime Victim Law Institute to provide
19 legal counsel and support services for victims in
20 criminal cases for the enforcement of crime victims’
21 rights in Federal jurisdictions, and in States and
22 tribal governments that have laws substantially
23 equivalent to the provisions of chapter 237 of title
24 18, United States Code; and”.

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
