- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Transit System Flexi-
- 5 bility Protection Act of 2007".

1 SEC. 2. GENERAL AUTHORITY.

Section 5307(b)(1) of title 49, United States Code, 2 is amended by striking subparagraph (E) and inserting the following: 4 5 "(E) operating costs of equipment and facilities for use in public transportation in an ur-6 7 banized area with a population of more than 200,000, if such public transportation system 8 9 operates less than 100 buses on fixed-route service during peak service hours; and". 10
