## A BILL

To abolish the death penalty under Federal law.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Death Penalty  
5 Abolition Act of 2007”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF FEDERAL LAWS PROVIDING FOR THE**  
7 **DEATH PENALTY.**

17 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON IMPOSITION OF DEATH SEN-**  
18 **TENCE.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-  
20 sion of law, no person may be sentenced to death or put  
21 to death on or after the date of enactment of this Act  
22 for any violation of Federal law.

23 (b) PERSONS SENTENCED BEFORE DATE OF ENACT-  
24 MENT.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any  
25 person sentenced to death before the date of enactment

1 of this Act for any violation of Federal law shall serve  
2 a sentence of life imprisonment without the possibility of  
3 parole.
