To provide for the transfer of certain Federal property to the United States Paralympics, Incorporated, a subsidiary of the United States Olympic Committee.

- 9 dition that the United States Olympic Committee agree to
- 10 operate, maintain, and manage the property for the benefit
- 11 of the United States Paralympics program.
- 12 (e) Additional Terms and Conditions.—The Ad-
- 13 ministrator may require that any conveyance under sub-
- 14 section (a) be subject to such additional terms and condi-
- 15 tions as the Administrator considers to be appropriate to
- 16 protect the interests of the United States.
