A BILL

For the relief of Majan Jean.

- Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR MAJAN

 JEAN.

 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)

 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality

 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Majan Jean shall be eligible for
- 8 issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of status
- 9 to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent resi-
- 10 dence upon filing an application for issuance of an immi-
- 11 grant visa under section 204 of that Act (8 U.S.C. 1154)
- 12 or for adjustment of status to lawful permanent resident.

- 1 (b) Adjustment of Status.—If Majan Jean enters
- 2 the United States before the filing deadline specified in
- 3 subsection (c), Majan Jean shall be considered to have en-
- 4 tered and remained lawfully and shall be eligible for ad-
- 5 justment of status under section 245 of the Immigration
- 6 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date of en-
- 7 actment of this Act.
- 8 (c) Deadline for Application and Payment of
- 9 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-
- 10 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the applica-
- 11 tion for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees
- 12 within 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act.
- 13 (d) Reduction of Immigrant Visa Numbers.—
- 14 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
- 15 idence to Majan Jean, the Secretary of State shall instruct
- 16 the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the current or
- 17 next following fiscal year, the total number of immigrant
- 18 visas that are made available to natives of the country of
- 19 birth of Majan Jean under section 203(a) of the Immigra-
- 20 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)) or, if applica-
- 21 ble, the total number of immigrant visas that are made
- 22 available to natives of the country of birth of Majan Jean
- 23 under section 202(e) of that Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).
