## JOINT RESOLUTION

To specify an expiration date for the authorization of use of military force under the Authorization for Use of Military Force Against Iraq Resolution of 2002 and to authorize the continuing presence of United States forces in Iraq after that date for certain military operations and activities.

2   *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXPIRATION OF AUTHORIZATION FOR USE OF**  
 2 **MILITARY FORCE AGAINST IRAQ.**

3 The authority conveyed by the Authorization for Use  
 4 of Military Force Against Iraq Resolution of 2002 (Public  
 5 Law 107–243) shall expire on December 31, 2007, unless  
 6 otherwise provided in a Joint Resolution (other than Pub-  
 7 lic Law 107–243) enacted by Congress.

8 **SEC. 2. ALLOWANCE FOR CERTAIN MILITARY OPERATIONS**  
 9 **AND ACTIVITIES.**

10 Section 1 shall not be construed as prohibiting or lim-  
 11 iting the presence of personnel or units of the Armed  
 12 Forces of the United States in Iraq after December 31,  
 13 2007, for the following purposes:

14 (1) Training, equipping, and advising Iraqi se-  
 15 curity and police forces.

16 (2) Force protection and security for United  
 17 States Armed Forces and civilian personnel.

18 (3) Support of Iraqi security forces for border  
 19 security and protection, to be carried out with the  
 20 minimum forces required for that purpose.

21 (4) Targeted counter-terrorism operations  
 22 against al Qaeda and foreign fighters within Iraq.

23 (5) Logistical support in connection with activi-  
 24 ties under paragraphs (1) through (4).
