## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of consecutive terms that a Member of Congress may serve.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*  
3       *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*  
4       *lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-*  
5       *stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all*  
6       *intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when*  
7       *ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several*  
8       *States within five years after the date of its submission*  
9       *for ratification:*

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “SECTION 1. No person who has been a Representa-  
3 tive for six full consecutive terms shall again be a Rep-  
4 resentative until the date that is one year after the end  
5 of the sixth full consecutive term.

6 “SECTION 2. For the purposes of this article, any  
7 term that began before the date of the ratification of this  
8 article shall not be included in determining the number  
9 of full consecutive terms that a person has been a Rep-  
10 resentative.”.
