## A BILL

To prohibit United States contributions to the United Nations for the purpose of paying or reimbursing the legal expenses of United Nations officers or employees charged with malfeasance, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. WITHHOLDING OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO UNITED

NATIONS FOR LEGAL FEES OF CERTAIN OFFICERS OR EMPLOYEES.

The United States may not contribute to the United

Nations any funds to be used to pay or reimburse legal

expenses incurred by current or former United Nations

- 1 officers or employees in connection with proceedings aris-
- 2 ing out of alleged malfeasance in connection with the em-
- 3 ployment of such officers or employees with the United
- 4 Nations. The President shall ensure that no United States
- 5 contributions to the United Nations are used for such pur-
- 6 poses, including, where necessary, by withholding from
- 7 United States contributions to the regularly assessed bien-
- 8 nial budget of the United Nations amounts equal to any
- 9 amounts so paid or reimbursed.
