#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Disabled Veterans
- 5 Commissary and Exchange Store Benefits Act".

PENDENTS.

4 (a) EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGES.—Chapter 54 of title
5 10, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
6 the following new section:

# 7 "§ 1065. Use of commissary and exchange stores: dis8 abled veterans and their dependents

9 "(a) DISABLED VETERANS.—A veteran with a com-10 pensable service-connected disability shall be permitted to 11 use commissary and exchange stores on the same basis 12 as a member of the armed forces entitled to retired or 13 retainer pay.

14 "(b) DEPENDENTS.—A dependent of a veteran de-15 scribed in subsection (a) shall be permitted to use com-16 missary and exchange stores on the same basis as a de-17 pendent of a member of the armed forces entitled to re-18 tired or retainer pay.

19 "(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms 'vet20 eran' and 'service-connected' have the meanings given
21 those terms in section 101 of title 38.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
at the end the following new item:

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Section 1065 of title 10,
 United States Code, as added by subsection (a), shall take
 effect at the end of the 90-day period beginning on the
 date of the enactment of this Act.
