## AN ACT

- To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to conduct a program in the maritime environment for the mobile biometric identification of suspected individuals, including terrorists, to enhance border security.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## SECTION 1. MARITIME BIOMETRIC IDENTIFICATION.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the
- 3 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Home-
- 4 land Security shall conduct, in the maritime environment,
- 5 a program for the mobile biometric identification of sus-
- 6 pected individuals, including terrorists, to enhance border
- 7 security and for other purposes.
- 8 (b) REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall ensure the
- 9 program described in subsection (a) is coordinated with
- 10 other biometric identification programs within the Depart-
- 11 ment of Homeland Security.
- 12 (c) Cost Analysis.—Not later than 90 days after
- 13 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
- 14 submit to the Committee on Appropriations and the Com-
- 15 mittee on Homeland Security of the House of Representa-
- 16 tives and the Committee on Appropriations and the Com-
- 17 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs
- 18 of the Senate an analysis of the cost of expanding the De-
- 19 partment's biometric identification capabilities for use by
- 20 departmental maritime assets considered appropriate by
- 21 the Secretary. The analysis may include a tiered plan for
- 22 the deployment of the program described in subsection (a)
- 23 that gives priority to vessels and units more likely to en-
- 24 counter individuals suspected of making unlawful border
- 25 crossings through the maritime environment.

- 1 (d) Definition.—For the purposes of this section,
- 2 the term "biometric identification" means the use of fin-
- 3 gerprint and digital photography images.
