A BILL

- To amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to require schools participating in the school lunch program under such Act to donate any excess food to local food banks.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "School Food Recovery
 - 5 Act".

1 SEC. 2. FOOD DONATION PROGRAM.

2	Section 9 of the Richard B. Russell National School
3	Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1758) is amended by adding at the
4	end the following:
5	"(k) Food Donation Program.—
6	"(1) In General.—The Secretary shall require
7	each school participating in the school lunch pro-
8	gram under this Act to donate any food not con-
9	sumed under such program to eligible local food
10	banks or charitable organizations.
11	"(2) Plan requirement.—Each school de-
12	scribed in paragraph (1) shall prepare and submit to
13	the local educational agency that serves such school
14	a plan that—
15	"(A) describes how such school will carry
16	out the food donation program requirements
17	under this subsection;
18	"(B) identifies the name and contact infor-
19	mation of the school employee administering the
20	food donation program; and
21	"(C) identifies any eligible local food banks
22	or charitable organizations that are located
23	within the jurisdiction of the same local govern-
24	ment as the local educational agency that serves
25	such school is located.

1 "(3) REPORTING REQUIREMENT.—Not later
2 than the first day of the fiscal year after the effec3 tive date of this subsection, and annually thereafter,
4 each local educational agency that receives plans
5 under paragraph (2) shall submit to the Secretary
6 such plans.

"(4) Database requirement.—Not later than 2 years after the effective date of this subsection, the Secretary shall develop and maintain a database of the information described in paragraph (2)(B).

"(5) GUIDANCE.—

"(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the effective date of this subsection, the Secretary shall develop and publish guidance to schools and local educational agencies participating in the school lunch program under this Act to assist such schools and local educational agencies in meeting the requirements of this subsection.

- "(B) UPDATES.—The Secretary shall update such guidance as necessary.
- "(6) Liability.—Any school or local educational agency making donations pursuant to this subsection shall be exempt from civil and criminal li-

1	ability to the extent provided under the Bill Emer-
2	son Good Samaritan Food Donation Act (42 U.S.C.
3	1791).
4	"(7) Definitions.—In this subsection:
5	"(A) ELIGIBLE LOCAL FOOD BANKS OR
6	CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS.—The phrase 'eli-
7	gible local food banks or charitable organiza-
8	tions' means any food bank or charitable orga-
9	nization which is exempt from tax under section
0	501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
1	(26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3)).
2	"(B) Local Government.—The term
3	'local government' means a city, county, town-
4	ship, or other general-purpose political subdivi-
5	sion of a State.".
6	SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
7	The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
Q	not later than July 1 of the year of the engetment of this
