## A BILL

To amend section 435(o) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 regarding the definition of economic hardship.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medical Economic
- 5 Deferment for Students (MEDS) Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF ECONOMIC HARDSHIP.
- 7 Section 435(o) of the Higher Education Act of 1965
- 8 (20 U.S.C. 1085(o)) is amended—
- 9 (1) in paragraph (1)—

1	(A) in subparagraph (A)(ii), by striking
2	"or" after the semicolon;
3	(B) by redesignating subparagraph (B) as
4	subparagraph (C); and
5	(C) by inserting after subparagraph (A)
6	the following:
7	"(B) such borrower is working full-time
8	and has a Federal educational debt burden that
9	equals or exceeds 20 percent of such borrower's
10	adjusted gross income, and the difference be-
11	tween such borrower's adjusted gross income
12	minus such burden is less than 220 percent of
13	the greater of—
14	"(i) the annual earnings of an indi-
15	vidual earning the minimum wage under
16	section 6 of the Fair Labor Standards Act
17	of 1938; or
18	"(ii) 150 percent of the poverty line,
19	as defined under section 673(2) of the
20	Community Services Block Grant Act, ap-
21	plicable to such borrower's family size; or";

23	(2) in paragraph (2), by striking "(1)(B)" and
24	inserting $(1)(C)$ .
