Ms. ESHOO introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

## A BILL

To establish a program to deploy and integrate plug-in electric drive vehicles in multiple regions.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LARGE-SCALE VEHICLE ELECTRIFICATION 4 PROGRAM.

5 (a) DEPLOYMENT PROGRAM.—The Secretary of En-6 ergy shall establish a program to deploy and integrate 7 plug-in electric drive vehicles in multiple regions. In car-8 rying out the program, the Secretary may provide finan-9 cial assistance described under subsection (d), consistent with the goals under subsection (b). The Secretary shall
 select regions based upon applications for assistance re ceived pursuant to subsection (c).

4 (b) GOALS.—The goals of the program established5 pursuant to subsection (a) shall be—

6 (1) to demonstrate the viability of a vehicle-7 based transportation system that is not overly de-8 pendent on petroleum as a fuel and contributes to 9 lower carbon emissions than a system based on con-10 ventional vehicles;

(2) to facilitate the integration of advanced vehicle technologies into electricity distribution areas
to improve system performance and reliability;

14 (3) to demonstrate the potential benefits of co15 ordinated investments in vehicle electrification on
16 personal mobility and a regional grid;

17 (4) to demonstrate protocols and standards that18 facilitate vehicle integration into the grid; and

19 (5) to investigate differences in each region and
20 regulatory environment regarding best practices in
21 implementing vehicle electrification.

(c) APPLICATIONS.—Any State or local government
(or group of State or local governments) may apply to the
Secretary of Energy for financial assistance in furthering
the regional deployment of plug-in electric drive vehicles.

Such applications may be jointly sponsored by electric util ities, automobile manufacturers, technology providers, car
 sharing companies or organizations, or other persons or
 entities.

5 (d) USE OF FUNDS.—Pursuant to applications re-6 ceived under subsection (c), the Secretary may make fi-7 nancial assistance available to any applicant or joint spon-8 sor of the application to be used for any of the following:

9 (1) Assisting persons located in the regional de-10 ployment area, including fleet owners, in the pur-11 chase of new plug-in electric drive vehicles by offset-12 ting in whole or in part the incremental cost of such 13 vehicles above the cost of comparable conventionally 14 fueled vehicles.

(2) Supporting the use of plug-in electric drive
vehicles by funding projects for the deployment of
any of the following:

18 (A) Electrical charging stations for plug-in
19 electric drive vehicles, including battery ex20 change, fast charging infrastructure, and other
21 services, in public or private locations, including
22 street parking, parking garages, parking lots,
23 homes, gas stations, and highway rest stops.

1 (B) Smart grid equipment and infrastruc-2 ture to facilitate the charging and integration of 3 plug-in electric drive vehicles. 4 (3) Such other projects as the Secretary deter-5 mines appropriate to support the large-scale deploy-6 ment of plug-in electric drive vehicles in regional de-7 ployment areas. 8 (e) PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall 9 determine design elements and requirements of the pro-10 gram established pursuant to subsection (a), including—

(1) the type of financial mechanism with whichto provide financial assistance;

(2) criteria for evaluating applications submitted under subsection (c), including the anticipated ability to promote deployment and market
penetration of vehicles that are less dependent on
petroleum as fuel source; and

(3) reporting requirements for entities that receive financial assistance under this section, including a comprehensive set of performance data characterizing the results of the deployment program.

(f) INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE.—The Secretary
shall, as part of the program established pursuant to subsection (a), collect and make available to the public information regarding the cost, performance, and other tech-

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nical data regarding the deployment and integration of
 plug-in electric drive vehicles.

3 (g) AUTHORIZATION.—There are authorized to be ap4 propriated to carry out this section, such sums as may
5 be necessary.

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
