A BILL

To amend title 39, United States Code, to require post offices to have running water and sanitation facilities, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Post Office Moderniza-
- 5 tion Act of 2009".
- 6 SEC. 2. WATER AND SANITATION REQUIREMENTS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Chapter 4 of title 39, United
- 8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
- 9 lowing new section:

1 "§ 417. Water and sanitation requirements

- 2 "The Postal Service shall ensure that every post of-
- 3 fice has access to running water and to bathroom facilities
- 4 connected to either a sewer system or a septic tank.".
- 5 (b) Non-Conforming Post Offices.—Not later
- 6 than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 7 the United States Postal Service shall begin upgrades to
- 8 ensure compliance with the requirements of section 417
- 9 of title 39, United States Code (as added by subsection
- 10 (a)).
- 11 (c) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
- 12 for chapter 4 of title 39, United States Code, is amended
- 13 by adding at the end the following:
 - "417. Water and sanitation requirements.".

14 SEC. 3. LACK OF FACILITIES NOT TO BE CONSIDERED.

- Section 404(d)(2)(B) of title 39, United States Code,
- 16 is amended to read as follows:
- 17 "(B) may not consider—
- 18 "(i) compliance with any provision of the
- Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970
- 20 (29 U.S.C. 651 et seq.); or
- 21 "(ii) whether the requirements of section
- 22 417 are met in connection with the post of-
- 23 fice.".
