Mr. Barton of Texas (for himself and Mr. Stearns) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To improve public participation and overall decisionmaking at the Federal Communications Commission, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FCC REFORM.
- 4 (a) In General.—The Communications Act of 1934
- 5 (47 U.S.C. 151 et seq.) is amended by inserting after sec-
- 6 tion 5 the following new section:
- 7 "SEC. 5A. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND COMMISSION DECI-
- 8 SIONMAKING.
- 9 "(a) Reform Measures.—The Commission shall
- 10 promulgate regulations in accordance with the following:

1	"(1) Except as provided in the third sentence of
2	section 553(b) of title 5, United States Code, before
3	adopting, modifying, or deleting a final regulation,
4	the Commission—
5	"(A) shall publish the specific language of
6	the proposed regulation, modification, or dele-
7	tion;
8	"(B) shall provide at least 30 days for the
9	submission of comments and an additional 30
10	days for the submission of reply comments on
11	such proposed regulation, modification, or dele-
12	tion; and
13	"(C) shall provide at least 30 days fol-
14	lowing the deadline for the submission of reply
15	comments for agency consideration on the
16	record on such proposed regulation, modifica-
17	tion, or deletion.
18	"(2) The Commission shall ensure that mem-
19	bers of the Commission have adequate time, prior to
20	being required to decide an issue (including at a
21	meeting held pursuant to section 5(d)), to review the
22	proposed Commission decision document, including
23	any specific language that is proposed to be adopted

as, modified in, or deleted from a regulation.

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1	"(3) The Commission shall establish deadlines
2	for any Commission order, decision, report, or action
3	for each of the various categories of petitions, appli-
4	cations, complaints, and other filings seeking Com-
5	mission action.
6	"(4) The Commission shall publish any order,
7	decision, report, or action of the Commission within
8	30 days after the date of the adoption of such order,
9	decision, report, or action.
10	"(5) The Commission shall notify by letter the
11	chairpersons and ranking members of the Committee
12	on Energy and Commerce of the House of Rep-
13	resentatives and the Committee on Commerce,
14	Science, and Transportation of the Senate—
15	"(A) indicating that an order, decision, re-
16	port, or action of the Commission was not pub-
17	lished within 30 days after the date of the
18	adoption of such order, decision, report, or ac-
19	tion;
20	"(B) identifying such order, decision, re-
21	port, or action; and
22	"(C) describing the reason for the delay.
23	The Commission shall update by letter such chair-
24	persons and ranking members every 14 days until

- the publication of such order, decision, report, or action.
 - "(6) For any year in which the Commission was required to provide a notice pursuant to paragraph (5), the Commission shall publish an annual report containing detailed statistics concerning the delay between the adoption and the publication of any such order, decision, report, or action.
 - "(7) The Commission shall publish on a weekly basis a summary list of documents containing proposed decisions pending review by the Commission. For all such decisions on such list for more than 60 days, the Commission shall also name any Commissioners who have not cast a vote on such decision. "(b) STATISTICAL REPORTS SCHEDULE.—
 - "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Commission shall catalog, identify, and publish the anticipated release schedule for all statistical reports regularly or intermittently published by the Commission and shall thereafter publish such schedule at least annually.
 - "(2) NOTIFICATION OF DELAY.—The Commission shall notify by letter the chairpersons and ranking members of the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives and the Com-

1	mittee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation of
2	the Senate—
3	"(A) indicating that a statistical report
4	was not published within 60 days after the date
5	specified in the anticipated release schedule
6	published under paragraph (1);
7	"(B) identifying such report; and
8	"(C) describing the reason for such delay.
9	The Commission shall update by letter such chair-
10	persons and ranking members every 30 days until
11	the publication of such report.
12	"(c) Definition.—For the purposes of this section,
13	the term 'regulation' has the meaning given the term 'rule'
14	in section 551(4) of title 5, United States Code.".
15	(b) Effective Dates.—
16	(1) Reform measures.—The Federal Commu-
17	nications Commission shall carry out section 5A(a)
18	of the Communications Act of 1934 (as added by
19	subsection (a)) within 6 months after the date of en-
20	actment of this Act.
21	(2) STATISTICAL REPORTS SCHEDULE.—The
22	Federal Communications Commission shall carry out
23	section 5A(b) of the Communications Act of 1934
24	(as added by subsection (a)) within 3 months after
25	the date of enactment of this Act.

- (3) Exception.—Notwithstanding paragraph 1 2 (1), in promulgating rules to carry out section 5A(a) 3 of the Communications Act of 1934 (as added by 4 subsection (a)), the Federal Communications Com-5 mission shall comply with the requirements of paragraphs (1), (2), and (4) of section 5A(a) of the 6 7 Communications Act of 1934 (as added by sub-8 section (a)).
- 9 SEC. 2. EFFECT ON OTHER LAWS.
- Nothing in this Act, including the amendments made 11 by this Act, shall absolve the Federal Communications 12 Commission from any obligations under title 5, United 13 States Code.

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
