AN ACT

- To amend title 31, United States Code, to enhance the oversight authorities of the Comptroller General, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Government Account-3 ability Office Improvement Act of 2010".

4 SEC. 2. AUTHORITY TO OBTAIN INFORMATION.

5 (a) AUTHORITY TO OBTAIN RECORDS.—Section 716
6 of title 31, United States Code, is amended in subsection
7 (a)—

8 (1) by striking "(a)" and inserting "(2)"; and
9 (2) by inserting after the section heading the
10 following:

11 "(a)(1) The Comptroller General is authorized to obtain such agency records as the Comptroller General re-12 13 quires to discharge his duties (including audit, evaluation, and investigative duties), including through the bringing 14 of civil actions under this section. In reviewing a civil ac-15 16 tion under this section, the court shall recognize the continuing force and effect of the authorization in the pre-17 ceding sentence until such time as the authorization is re-18 19 pealed pursuant to law.".

(b) COPIES AND INTERVIEWS.—Section 716(a) of
title 31, United States Code, as amended by subsection
(a), is further amended in the second sentence of paragraph (2) by striking "inspect an agency record" and inserting "inspect, and make and retain copies of, an agency
record and interview agency officers and employees".

(c) RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.—Section 716 of title
 31, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
 the following new subsection:

4 "(f) No provision of any law in existence on the date 5 of the enactment of this section or enacted after such date shall be construed to limit, amend, or supersede the au-6 7 thority of the Comptroller General to obtain any informa-8 tion, to inspect any record, or to interview any officer or 9 employee under this section, except to the extent such pro-10 vision expressly and specifically refers to this section and provides for such limitation, amendment, or superses-11 sion.". 12

13 SEC. 3. ADMINISTERING OATHS.

14 Paragraph (4) of section 711 of title 31, United15 States Code, is amended to read as follows:

"(4) administer oaths to witnesses, except that,
in matters other than auditing and settling accounts,
the authority of an officer or employee to administer
oaths to witnesses pursuant to a delegation under
paragraph (2) shall not be available without the
prior express approval of the Comptroller General
(or a designee).".

23 SEC. 4. AGENCY REPORTS.

24 Section 720(b) of title 31, United States Code, is
25 amended—

1 (1) in the matter preceding paragraph (1), by 2 inserting "or planned" after "action taken"; and 3 (2) by amending paragraph (1) to read as fol-4 lows: "(1) the Committee on Homeland Security and 5 6 Governmental Affairs of the Senate, the Committee 7 on Oversight and Government Operations of the House of Representatives, the congressional commit-8 9 tees with jurisdiction over the agency program or activity that is the subject of the recommendation, and 10 the Government Accountability Office before the 11 12 61st day after the date of the report; and".
