A BILL

To modify the boundary of the Oregon Caves National Monument, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-				
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,				
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.				
4	This Act may be cited as the "Oregon Caves National				
5	Monument Boundary Adjustment Act of 2010".				
6	SEC. 2. PURPOSE.				
7	The purpose of this Act is to add surrounding land				
8	to the Monument—				
9	(1) to enhance the protection of the resources as-				
10	sociated with the Monument; and				
11	(2) to increase public recreation opportunities.				
12	SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.				
13	In this Act:				
14	(1) MAP.—The term "map" means the map ti-				
15	tled "Oregon Caves National Monument and Pre-				
16	serve" numbered 150/80,023, and dated May 2010.				
17	(2) Monument.—The term "Monument" means				
18	the Oregon Caves National Monument established by				
19	Presidential Proclamation Number 876 (36 Stat.				
20	2497), dated July 12, 1909.				
21	(3) National preserve.—The term "National				
22	Preserve" means the National Preserve designated by				
23	section $4(a)$.				
24	(4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means				
25	the Secretary of the Interior.				

1	(5) Secretary concerned.—The term "Sec-
2	retary concerned" means—
3	(A) the Secretary of Agriculture (acting
4	through the Chief of the Forest Service), with re-
5	spect to National Forest System land; and
6	(B) the Secretary of the Interior, with re-
7	spect to land managed by the Bureau of Land
8	Management.
9	(6) State.—The term "State" means the State
10	of Oregon.
11	SEC. 4. DESIGNATION; LAND TRANSFER; BOUNDARY AD-
12	JUSTMENT.
13	(a) In General.—The Monument shall be known and
14	designated as the "Oregon Caves National Monument and
15	Preserve". The land identified on the map as "Proposed Ad-
16	dition Lands" shall be designated as a National Preserve.
17	(b) Land Transfer.—The Secretary of Agriculture
18	shall—
19	(1) transfer approximately 4,070 acres of land
20	identified on the map as the "Proposed Addition
21	Lands" to the Secretary to be administered as part
22	of the Oregon Caves National Monument and Pre-
23	serve; and

1	(2) adjust the boundary of the Rogue River-					
2	Siskiyou National Forest to exclude the land trans-					
3	ferred under paragraph (1).					
4	(c) Boundary Adjustment.—The boundary of the					
5	National Monument is modified to exclude approximately					
6	4 acres of land—					
7	(1) located in the City of Cave Junction; and					
8	(2) identified on the map as the "Cave Junction					
9	Unit", as depicted on the map.					
10	(d) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file					
11	and available for public inspection in the appropriate of-					
12	fices of the National Park Service.					
13	(e) References.—Any reference in a law, map, regu-					
14	lation, document, paper, or other record of the United					
15	States to the Monument shall be considered to be a reference					
16	to the "Oregon Caves National Monument and Preserve".					
17	SEC. 5. ADMINISTRATION.					
18	(a) In General.—The Secretary, acting through the					
19	Director of the National Park Service, shall administer the					
20	National Monument and Preserve in accordance with—					
21	(1) this Act;					
22	(2) Presidential Proclamation Number 876 (36					
23	Stat. 2497), dated July 12, 1909; and					
24	(3) any law (including regulations) generally					
25	applicable to units of the National Park System, in-					

- 1 cluding the National Park Service Organic Act (16
- U.S.C. 1 et seq.).
- 3 (b) Fire Management.—As soon as practicable after
- 4 the date of enactment of this Act, in accordance with sub-
- 5 section (a), the Secretary shall revise the fire management
- 6 plan for the Monument to include the National Preserve
- 7 and, in accordance with the revised plan, carry out haz-
- 8 ardous fuel management activities within the boundaries
- 9 of the National Monument and Preserve.
- 10 (c) Existing Forest Service Contracts.—The
- 11 Secretary shall allow for the completion of existing Forest
- 12 Service stewardship and service contracts executed as of the
- 13 date of enactment of this Act and shall recognize the author-
- 14 ity of the Secretary of Agriculture for the purpose of admin-
- 15 istering the existing Forest Service contracts through their
- 16 completion. All terms and conditions of existing Forest
- 17 Service contracts shall remain in place for the duration of
- 18 those contracts. Any such liability existing at the time of
- 19 enactment of this Act shall be that of the Forest Service.
- 20 (d) Grazing.—The Secretary may allow the grazing
- 21 of livestock within the preserve to continue where authorized
- 22 under permits or leases in existence as of the date of enact-
- 23 ment of this Act. Grazing shall be at no more than the cur-
- 24 rent level, as measured in Animal Unit Months, and subject
- 25 to applicable laws and National Park Service regulations.

1 SEC. 6. VOLUNTARY GRAZING LEASE OR PERMIT DONATION

2	PROGRAM.					
3	(a) Donation of Lease or Permit.—					
4	(1) Acceptance by secretary concerned.—					
5	The Secretary concerned shall accept the donation of					
6	a grazing lease or permit from a leasee or permittee					
7	for—					
8	(A) the Big Grayback Grazing Allotment lo-					
9	cated in the Rogue River-Siskiyou National For-					
10	est; and					
11	(B) the Billy Mountain Grazing Allotment					
12	located on a parcel of land that is managed by					
13	the Secretary (acting through the Director of the					
14	Bureau of Land Management).					
15	(2) Termination.—With respect to each permit					
16	or lease donated under subparagraph (a), the Sec-					
17	retary shall—					
18	(A) terminate the grazing permit or lease;					
19	and					
20						
	(B) ensure a permanent end to grazing on					
21	the land covered by the permit or lease.					
22	(b) Effect of Donation.—A lessee or permittee that					
23	donates a grazing lease or grazing permit (or a portion of					
24	a grazing lease or grazing permit) under this section shall					
25	be considered to have waived any claim to any range im-					

- 1 provement on the associated grazing allotment or portion
- 2 of the associated grazing allotment, as applicable.
- 3 SEC. 7. HUNTING, FISHING, AND TRAPPING.
- 4 (a) In General.—Except as provided in subsection
- 5 (b), the Secretary shall permit hunting, fishing, and trap-
- 6 ping on land and water within the National Preserve in
- 7 accordance with each applicable law (including regula-
- 8 tions) of the Federal Government and the State.
- 9 (b) Administrative Exceptions.—In accordance
- 10 with subsection (c), the Secretary may designate areas in
- 11 which, and establish limited periods during which, no hunt-
- 12 ing, fishing, or trapping may be permitted within the Na-
- 13 tional Preserve due to concerns relating to—
- 14 (1) public safety;
- 15 (2) the administration of the National Preserve;
- 16 *or*
- 17 (3) the compliance by the Secretary with any
- 18 applicable law (including regulations).
- 19 (c) Consultation With Appropriate State Agen-
- 20 CY.—Except to respond to a situation that the Secretary
- 21 determines to be an emergency, the Secretary shall consult
- 22 with the appropriate agency of the State before taking any
- 23 act to close any area within the National Preserve to hunt-
- 24 ing, fishing, or trapping.

1	SEC. 8. EFFECT.
2	Nothing in this Act affects the authority or responsi-
3	bility of the State to carry out any law or duty of the State
4	relating to fish and wildlife on areas located within the Na-
5	tional Preserve.
6	SEC. 9. WILD AND SCENIC RIVER DESIGNATION, RIVER
7	STYX, OREGON.
8	Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
9	U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by inserting the following
10	paragraph:
11	"() River styx, oregon.—The subterra-
12	nean segment of Cave Creek, known as the River
13	Styx, to be administered by the Secretary of the Inte-
14	rior as a scenic river.".
15	SEC. 10. WILD AND SCENIC RIVER DESIGNATION FOR
16	STUDY.
17	Section 5(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16
18	U.S.C. 1276(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
19	lowing:
20	"() Oregon caves national monument
21	AND PRESERVE, OREGON.—
22	"(A) CAVE CREEK, OREGON.—The 2.6-mile
23	segment of Cave Creek from the headwaters at
24	the River Styx to the boundary of the Rogue

 $River\ Siskiyou\ National\ Forest.$

1	"(B) Lake Creek, oregon.—The 3.6-mile					
2	segment of Lake Creek from the headwaters at					
3	Bigelow Lakes to the confluence with Cave Creek					
4	"(C) NO NAME CREEK, OREGON.—The 0.6					
5	mile segment of No Name Creek from the head-					
6	waters to the confluence with Cave Creek.					
7	"(D) Panther creek.—The 0.8-mile seg					
8	ment of Panther Creek from the headwaters to					
9	the confluence with Lake Creek.					
10	"(E) UPPER CAVE CREEK.—The segment of					
11	Upper Cave Creek from the headwaters to the					
12	confluence with River Styx.".					
13	SEC. 11. STUDY AND REPORT.					
14	Section 5(b) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16					
15	U.S.C. 1276(b)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-					
16	lowing:					
17	"() Oregon caves national monument					
18	AND PRESERVE, OREGON.—Not later than 3 years					
19	after funds are made available to carry out this para-					
20	graph, the Secretary shall complete the study of the					
21	Oregon Caves National Monument and Preserve seg-					
22	ments designated for study in subsection (a), and					
23	shall submit to Congress a report containing the re-					
24	sults of the study.".					

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
