A BILL

To repeal the wage rate requirements commonly known as
the Davis-Bacon Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Davis-Bacon Repeal
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF DAVIS-BACON WAGE REQUIREMENTS.**

7 Subchapter IV of chapter 31 of title 40, United
8 States Code, is repealed.

1 **SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS REPEAL.**

2 Section 276c of title 40, United States Code, is re-
3 pealed.

4 **SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND LIMITATION.**

5 The amendments made by sections 2 and 3 shall take
6 effect 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act
7 but shall not affect any contract in existence on such date
8 of enactment or made pursuant to invitation for bids out-
9 standing on such date of enactment.
