A BILL

To repeal the wage rate requirements commonly known as the Davis-Bacon Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Davis-Bacon Repeal
- 5 Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF DAVIS-BACON WAGE REQUIREMENTS.
- 7 Subchapter IV of chapter 31 of title 40, United
- 8 States Code, is repealed.

1 SEC. 3. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS REPEAL.

- 2 Section 276c of title 40, United States Code, is re-
- 3 pealed.
- 4 SEC. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND LIMITATION.
- 5 The amendments made by sections 2 and 3 shall take
- 6 effect 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act
- 7 but shall not affect any contract in existence on such date
- 8 of enactment or made pursuant to invitation for bids out-
- 9 standing on such date of enactment.
