A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to establish a grant program to assist innovative natural disaster first responder programs, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "First Responder Inno-
- 5 vation and Support Act of 2009".

1 SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM.

- 3 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5131 et seq.) is
- 4 amended by adding at the end the following:
- 5 "SEC. 205. FIRST RESPONDER INNOVATION AND SUPPORT
- 6 GRANT PROGRAM.
- 7 "(a) IN GENERAL.—The President may make grants
- 8 to eligible entities to assist innovative natural disaster first
- 9 responder programs in accordance with this section.
- 10 "(b) APPLICATION.—To be eligible for a grant under
- 11 this section, an eligible entity shall submit an application
- 12 to the President. Such application shall include, at a min-
- 13 imum, a description of each of the following:
- 14 "(1) The purpose for which the grant is sought
- and the reason Federal assistance is needed for such
- purpose.
- 17 "(2) The innovation with respect to natural dis-
- aster first responders to be achieved with the grant.
- 19 "(3) The plans, if any, of the eligible entity to
- allocate amounts from the grant to local govern-
- 21 ments and federally recognized Indian tribes.
- 22 "(4) A budget for the expected expenditure of
- 23 the grant amounts.
- 24 "(c) Selection Criteria.—The President shall
- 25 issue regulations establishing selection criteria for making

- 1 grants under this section. Such criteria shall include con-
- 2 sideration of the following:
- 3 "(1) The severity and frequency of natural dis-
- 4 asters that affect the eligible entity applying for the
- 5 grant.
- 6 "(2) Whether existing natural disaster first re-
- 7 sponder systems would be improved by the grant.
- 8 "(3) Whether the grant would provide natural
- 9 disaster first responder support for special popu-
- lations, including children, pregnant women, the el-
- derly, and the disabled.
- "(4) Whether the activity assisted by the grant
- is sustainable with non-Federal amounts after such
- 14 grant is made.
- 15 "(d) TIMING AND NUMBER OF GRANTS.—The Presi-
- 16 dent shall make grants under this section annually and
- 17 an eligible entity may apply for multiple grants under this
- 18 section each year. An eligible entity is not limited in the
- 19 number of grants such entity may receive under this sec-
- 20 tion.
- 21 "(e) Competitive Basis.—The President shall
- 22 make grants under this section on a competitive basis sub-
- 23 ject to the requirements of this section.

- 1 "(f) REGULATIONS.—Not later than one year after
- 2 the date of enactment of this section, the President shall
- 3 issue regulations necessary to carry out this section.
- 4 "(g) Definitions.—In this section, the following
- 5 definitions apply:
- 6 "(1) Eligible entity.—The term 'eligible en-
- 7 tity' means any of the 50 States, the District of Co-
- 8 lumbia, any federally recognized Indian tribe, and
- 9 any territory or possession of the United States that
- has an approved mitigation plan under section 322.
- 11 "(2) First responder.—The term 'first re-
- sponder' means an individual who in the early stages
- of an incident is responsible for the protection and
- preservation of life, property, evidence, and the envi-
- ronment, including emergency response providers (as
- such term is defined under section 2 of the Home-
- 17 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101)) and
- 18 emergency management, public health, clinical care,
- public works, and other skilled support personnel,
- 20 including equipment operators, that provide imme-
- 21 diate support services during prevention, response,
- and recovery operations.
- 23 "(3) Natural disaster.—The term 'natural
- disaster' has the meaning given such term under
- 25 section 602.

1 "(4) President.—The term 'President' means 2 the President, acting through the Administrator of 3 the Federal Emergency Management Agency. 4 "(h) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There 5 is authorized to be appropriated to the President to carry 6 out this section \$100,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2010 7 through 2015. Such sums shall remain available until ex-8 pended.".
