A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to designate the Dr. Norman E. Borlaug Birthplace and Childhood Home in Cresco, Iowa, as a National Historic Site and unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DR. NORMAN E. BORLAUG BIRTHPLACE AND**
4 **CHILDHOOD HOME NATIONAL HISTORIC**
5 **SITE.**

6 (a) ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY; ESTABLISHMENT OF
7 HISTORIC SITE.—Should the Secretary of the Interior ac-

1 quire, by donation from the Norman Borlaug Heritage
2 Foundation, fee simple, unencumbered title to the Norman
3 E. Borlaug Birthplace site located at 20399 Timber Ave-
4 nue, Cresco, Iowa, and the Norman E. Borlaug Childhood
5 Home site located at 19518 200th Street, Cresco, Iowa,
6 and any personal property related to the sites, the Sec-
7 retary shall designate that property as a National Historic
8 Site and unit of the National Park System to be known
9 as the “Dr. Norman E. Borlaug Birthplace Home Na-
10 tional Historic Site”.

11 (b) APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAWS.—The Sec-
12 retary shall administer the Dr. Norman E. Borlaug Birth-
13 place Home National Historic Site in accordance with the
14 laws generally applicable to national historic sites, includ-
15 ing the Act titled “An Act to establish a National Park
16 Service, and for other purposes”, approved August 25,
17 1916 (16 U.S.C. 1–4), and the Act titled “An Act to pro-
18 vide for the preservation of historic American sites, build-
19 ings, objects and antiquities of national significance, and
20 for other purposes”, approved August 21, 1935 (16
21 U.S.C. 461 et seq.).
