# A BILL

- To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the National Future Farmers of America Organization and the 85th anniversary of the founding of the National Future Farmers of America Organization.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National Future5 Farmers of America Commemorative Coin Act of 2009".

#### 1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2	The	Congress	finds	that—

3 (1) the National Future Farmers of America 4 Organization makes a positive difference in the lives 5 of students by developing their potential for leader-6 ship, personal growth, and career success through 7 agricultural education;

8 (2) the National Future Farmers of America 9 Organization was founded in 1928, as the "Future 10 Farmers of America", to provide leadership training 11 for high school students of vocational agriculture;

12 (3) the National Future Farmers of America 13 Organization created a national agricultural education model for use in public school systems that 14 15 has been adopted by youth leadership organizations 16 throughout the world;

17 (4) the National Future Farmers of America 18 Organization prepares its student members to think 19 critically, work in teams, and be successful in more 20 than 300 careers relating to the science, business, 21 and technology of agriculture;

22 approximately 9,000,000 living former (5)23 members of the National Future Farmers of Amer-24 ica Organization are prominent industry executives, members of Congress, community members, farmers, 25 26

and productive United States citizens;

1	(6) in 2009, the National Future Farmers of
2	America Organization had 507,763 members in
3	more than 7,400 local chapters in all 50 States,
4	Puerto Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands;
5	(7) the Future Farmers of America was char-
6	tered by Congress in 1950, and continues to be an
7	intra-curricular educational organization within pub-
8	lic school systems throughout the United States; and
9	(8) October 2012 will mark the beginning of a
10	year of celebration in honor of the 85th anniversary
11	of the founding of the National Future Farmers of
12	America Organization, which took place at the first
13	national convention of the National Future Farmers
14	of America Organization.
15	SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
16	(a) DENOMINATIONS.—In commemoration of the Na-
17	tional Future Farmers of America Organization and the
18	85th anniversary of the National Future Farmers of
19	America Organization, the Secretary of the Treasury (in
20	this Act referred to as the "Secretary") shall mint and
21	issue—
22	(1) not more than 100,000 gold coins, which
23	shall—

24 (A) weigh 8.359 grams;

25 (B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and

1	(C) contain 90 percent gold and 10 percent
2	alloy; and
3	(2) not more than 500,000 silver coins, which
4	shall—
5	(A) weigh 26.7 grams;
6	(B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and
7	(C) contain 90 percent silver and 10 per-
8	cent copper.
9	(b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this
10	Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
11	title 31, United States Code.
12	(c) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of sections
13	5134 and 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all coins

5	(b) SELECTION.—The design for the coins minted
6	under this Act shall be—
7	(1) selected by the Secretary, after consultation
8	with the National Future Farmers of America Orga-
9	nization and the Commission of Fine Arts; and
10	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory
11	Committee.
12	SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.
13	(a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
14	Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
15	(b) Period of Issuance.—The Secretary may issue
16	coins under this Act only for the 1-year period beginning
17	on January 1, 2012.
18	SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.
19	(a) SALE PRICE.—The coins minted under this Act
20	shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
21	of—
22	(1) the face value of the coins;
23	(2) the surcharge provided in section 7 with re-

24 spect to such coins; and

(3) the cost of designing and minting the coins
 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,
 overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).

4 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk
5 sales of the coins minted under this Act at a reasonable
6 discount.

7 (c) Prepaid Orders.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
9 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act
10 before the issuance of such coins.

(2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to prepaid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a reasonable discount.

## 14 SEC. 7. SURCHARGES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins minted under
this Act shall include a surcharge of \$25 per gold coin
and \$10 per silver coin.

(b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f) of
title 31, United States Code, the Secretary shall pay all
of the surcharges received by the Secretary from the sale
of coins minted under this Act to the National Future
Farmers of America Foundation in Indianapolis, Indiana,
for the creation of an endowment to enhance and expand
programs that encourage the development of leadership

skills, personal growth, and career success through agri cultural education and the Future Farmers of America.
 (c) AUDITS.—The Comptroller General of the United
 States is authorized to examine such books, records, docu ments, and other data of the organization described in
 subsection (b) as may be related to the expenditures of
 amounts paid under subsection (b).
