A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to strengthen penalties for child pornography offenses, child sex trafficking offenses, and other sexual offenses committed against children.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Prevention and Deter-
- 5 rence of Crimes Against Children Act of 2009".

SEC. 4. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR CHILD SEX OFFENSES
RESULTING IN DEATH, REPEATED CHILD SEX
CRIMES, AND FORCIBLE RAPE.
(a) In General.—Section 2245 of title 18, United
States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol
lowing:
"(b) Offenses Involving Children.—A person
who, in the course of an offense under this chapter, chap
ter 110, chapter 117, or section 1591 engages in conduc
that results in the death of a person who has not attained
the age of 18 years, shall be punished by death or impris
oned for not less than 30 years or for life.".
(b) Classification of Offenses.—Section
3559(e)(2)(A) of title 18, United States Code, is amended

(c) Sexual Abuse.—Section 2241 of title 18
United States Code, is amended—

5	SEC. 5. SEX TOURISM AND REMOVAL OF SEX OFFENDERS.
6	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall no-
7	tify—
8	(1) the Secretary of State in a timely manner
9	regarding any conviction of an individual of a viola-
10	tion of section 2423 of title 18, United States Code,
11	for appropriate action under subsection (b) of this
12	section; and
13	(2) the Secretary of Homeland Security in a
14	timely manner regarding any conviction of an alien
15	of a sex offense for appropriate action under sub-
16	section (c) of this section.
17	(b) AUTHORITY TO RESTRICT PASSPORT.—The Sec-
18	retary of State—
19	(1) shall refuse to issue a passport to an indi-
20	vidual if the Secretary receives a notice under sub-
21	section (a) that such individual was convicted of a
22	violation of section 2423 of title 18, United States
23	Code; and
24	(2) may revoke, restrict, or limit a passport
25	issued to an individual convicted of a violation of

1	section 2423 of title 18, United States Code, if the
2	passport was used in furtherance of that violation.
3	(c) Removal of Aliens.—The Secretary of Home-
4	land Security shall place an alien convicted of a sex offense
5	in removal proceedings under section 240 of the Immigra-
6	tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1229a).
7	(d) Grounds of Inadmissibility and Remov-
8	ABILITY.—
9	(1) In general.—Section 212(a)(2) of the Im-
10	migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(2))
11	is amended by adding at the end the following:
12	"(J) SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR.—
13	"(i) In general.—An alien who is
14	convicted of sexual abuse of a minor is in-
15	admissible.
16	"(ii) Sex offenses.—For purposes
17	of this subparagraph, an alien who has
18	been convicted of a sex offense (as that
19	term is defined in section 111 of the Adam
20	Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of
21	2006 (42 U.S.C. 16911)) shall be consid-
22	ered to have been convicted of sexual abuse
23	of a minor. An alien convicted of a sex of-
24	fense shall be ineligible for any discre-
25	tionary relief under this Act.".

1	(2) DEPORTABLE ALIENS.—Section
2	237(a)(2)(A)(iii) of the Immigration and Nationality
3	Act (8 U.S.C. 1227(a)(2)(A)(iii)) is amended by
4	adding at the end the following: "For purposes of
5	this clause, an alien who has been convicted of a sex
6	offense (as that term is defined in section 111 of the
7	Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of
8	2006 (42 U.S.C. 16911)) shall be considered to have
9	been convicted of sexual abuse of a minor.".
10	(e) Definition of Sex Offense.—In this section,
11	the term "sex offense" has the meaning given that term
12	in section 111 of the Adam Walsh Child Protection and
13	Safety Act of 2006 (42 U.S.C. 16911).
