5	(a) Assistance Provided.—The Secretary of Vet-
6	erans Affairs shall provide grants and other assistance to
7	States for the purpose of providing outreach to veterans
8	who may be able to apply for a change in priority under
9	the patient enrollment system maintained by the Secretary
10	under section 1705 of title 38, United States Code, due
11	to hardship.
12	(b) Priority for Certain States.—In providing
13	grants and assistance under subsection (a), the Secretary
14	shall give priority to States with—
15	(1) veteran populations of at least 500,000; and
16	(2) unemployment rates that exceed the na-
17	tional average unemployment rate.
18	(c) Limitation.—For any fiscal year, not more than
19	20 percent of the amount of the funds made available for
20	the provision of grants and assistance under subsection
21	(a) shall be provided to any one State.
22	(d) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
23	are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this Act
24	such sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years
25	2010 through 2014.
