A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a study of the suitability and feasibility of expanding the boundary of Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 This Act may be cited as the "Chattahoochee River
 National Recreation Area Boundary Study Act of 2009".
 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
 In this Act:

8 (1) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
9 the Secretary of the Interior.

10 (2) RECREATION AREA.—The term "recreation
11 area" means the Chattahoochee River National
12 Recreation Area in the State of Georgia.

13 (3) STUDY AREA.—The term "study area"
14 means the area of the Chattahoochee River and land
15 along the river corridor described in section 3(a)
16 that is the subject of the study authorized by this
17 Act.

18 SEC. 3. BOUNDARY STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary is authorized to
conduct a study to determine the suitability and feasibility
of including in the boundary of the recreation area approximately 45 miles of the Chattahoochee River and
lands along the river corridor from the southern boundary
of the recreation area south to the junction of Coweta,
Heard, and Carroll Counties.

1	(b) CONTENTS.—The study authorized under this
2	Act shall include an analysis of—
3	(1) significant resources or opportunities for
4	public enjoyment within the study area related to
5	purposes of the recreation area;
6	(2) operational and management issues that
7	need to be considered if the study area is included
8	within the recreation area;
9	(3) protection of resources within the study
10	area critical to fulfilling the recreation area's pur-
11	poses;
12	(4) the feasibility of administering the study
13	area as part of the recreation area considering the
14	study area's size, configuration, ownership, costs,
15	and other factors; and
16	(5) the adequacy of other alternatives for man-
17	agement and protection of resources within the
18	study area.
19	(c) REPORT.—Not later than three years after the
20	date on which funds are made available to carry out this
21	Act, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Nat-
22	ural Resources of the House of Representatives and the
23	Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen-
24	ate a report that describes the findings and conclusions

of the study and any recommendations of the Secretary.
