



1           (1) to assist individuals to lower their risks of  
2 chronic disease;

3           (2) to achieve overall reductions in the inci-  
4 dence of chronic disease on a national scale; and

5           (3) to lay the foundation for future policies that  
6 incentivize achievements based on the matrix.

7       (b) FACTORS.—The matrix under subsection (a) shall  
8 consist of easily measurable, demonstrable, clinical factors  
9 as follows:

10           (1) Achieving the recommended body mass  
11 index for an individual’s height and weight, or alter-  
12 natively, an individual’s recommended waist circum-  
13 ference.

14           (2) Achieving recommended lipid profile levels  
15 that make up a full lipid panel, or alternatively the  
16 recommended ratio of high density lipoprotein  
17 (HDL) to low density lipoprotein (LDL).

18           (3) Achieving the recommended blood pressure  
19 level.

20           (4) Completing all cancer screenings for age  
21 and gender, based on guidelines of the U.S. Preven-  
22 tive Services Task Force.

23           (5) Achieving non-smoking status.

- 1           (6) Achieving the recommended fasting blood
- 2           sugar level (or, if diabetic, the recommended hemo-
- 3           globin A1c level).

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
