A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to make certain improvements in the laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs relating to educational assistance for health professionals, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Health Pro-
- 5 fessionals Educational Assistance Act of 2009".

1	SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF HEALTH PROFESSIONALS
2	EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE SCHOLARSHIP
3	PROGRAM.
4	(a) In General.—Section 7618 of title 38, United

- 9 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
- 10 may, in consultation with the Secretary of Health and
- 11 Human Services, utilize the authorities available in section
- 12 487E of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 288–
- 13 5) for the repayment of the principal and interest of edu-
- 14 cational loans of appropriately qualified health profes-

- 9 (a) Inclusion of Facilities.—The Secretary of
- 10 Veterans Affairs shall transfer up to \$20,000,000 from
- 11 accounts of the Veterans Health Administration to the
- 12 Secretary of Health and Human Services to be used to
- 13 include facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs
- 14 on the list maintained by the Health Resources and Serv-
