## A BILL

To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to continue using 2009 Medicare practice expense relative value units for certain cardiology services.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. CONTINUED USE OF 2009 MEDICARE PRACTICE
4	EXPENSE RELATIVE VALUE UNITS FOR CER-
5	TAIN CARDIOLOGY SERVICES.
6	Section 1848(c)(2) of the Social Security Act (42
7	U.S.C. $1395w-4(c)(2)$ ) is amended by adding at the end
8	the following new subparagraph:
9	"(K) CONTINUED USE OF 2009 PRACTICE
10	EXPENSE RELATIVE VALUE UNITS FOR CERTAIN
11	CARDIOLOGY SERVICES.—
12	"(i) In General.—Notwithstanding
13	any other provision of law, including provi-
14	sions contained in the final rule published
15	in the Federal Register on November 25,
16	2009 (74 Fed. Reg. 61737), relating to CY
17	2010 relative value units, subject to clause
18	(iii) and the second sentence of clause (iv),
19	in determining the practice expense pay-
20	ment under this paragraph for services
21	performed predominantly by cardiologists
22	and furnished on or after January 1, 2010,
23	the Secretary shall continue practice ex-
24	pense relative value units at the levels for
25	CY 2009 for such services. For purposes of

the previous sentence, the services performed predominantly by cardiologists include (as determined by the Secretary) cardiac monitoring services, services performed primarily for the diagnosis or treatment of heart disease, and other services at least 50 percent of which are performed under this part by cardiologists.

"(ii) Inclusion of specific cardiac codes.—In determining practice expense relative value units under this paragraph for myocardial perfusion imaging (CPT codes 78451–78454) for services furnished on or after January 1, 2010, subject to clause (iii) and the second sentence of clause (iv), the Secretary shall use the 2009 practice expense relative value units for the previous codes that were combined to create such CPT codes.

"(iii) New CPT CODE IMPLEMENTA-TION PERMITTED.—Nothing in clause (i) or (ii) shall be construed to prevent new category I CPT codes related to cardiovascular computed tomography and cardiovascular magnetic resonance imaging, pub-

1	lished in the rule referred to in clause (i),
2	from taking effect on January 1, 2010.
3	"(iv) Study and report on prac-
4	TICE EXPENSE METHODOLOGY.—The Sec-
5	retary, in consultation with medical spe-
6	cialty society stakeholders and other af-
7	fected stakeholders, shall enter into a con-
8	tract with an independent entity—
9	"(I) to conduct a study of the
10	practice expense methodology used to
11	determine relative value units under
12	this paragraph to determine whether
13	the cost finding, indirect cost alloca-
14	tion, scaling, and budget neutrality
15	methodologies used are consistent
16	with generally accepted accounting
17	principles, distribute the burden of
18	any necessary budget neutrality ad-
19	justments proportionally among all
20	physicians' services, comparison to
21	other payment methodologies, and re-
22	sult in allowances that accurately re-
23	flect the relative direct and indirect
24	resources involved in the provision of
25	various physicians' services; and

1	"(II) to submit to the Secretary
2	and Congress no later than January
3	1, 2011, a report on such study that
4	includes recommendations for deter-
5	mining practice expense under this
6	subsection.
7	Upon completion of such study, the Sec
8	retary may adjust the practice expense rel-
9	ative value units described in clause (i) and
10	the codes described in clause (ii) for serv-
11	ices furnished on or after such date (no
12	earlier than January 1, 2012) as the Sec
13	retary may specify.
14	"(v) No budget neutrality ad-
15	JUSTMENT.—The Secretary shall not make
16	any reduction in relative value units of
17	other budget neutrality adjustments pursu-
18	ant to the application of the previous pro-

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visions of this subparagraph.".

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
