1 SEC. 2. TRIAL OF FOREIGN TERRORISTS.

2 After the date of the enactment of this Act, any for-3 eign national, who—

4 (1) engages or has engaged in conduct consti5 tuting an offense relating to a terrorist attack
6 against persons or property in the United States or
7 against any United States Government property or
8 personnel outside the United States; and

9 (2) is subject to trial for that offense by a mili10 tary commission under chapter 47A of title 10,
11 United States Code;

12 shall be tried for that offense only by a military commis-13 sion under that chapter.
