A BILL

To preclude individuals who have a pending charge or have been convicted of a crime from serving as enumerators for the collection of census data.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PRECLUSION OF CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS FROM
- 4 SERVING AS ENUMERATORS.
- 5 Section 25 of title 13, United States Code, is amend-
- 6 ed by adding at the end the following:
- 7 "(c) An individual who has a pending charge for a
- 8 crime, or has been convicted of a crime in any court may
- 9 not serve as an enumerator under this section.

- 1 "(d) For the purposes of this section, the term crime
- 2 means any criminal offense other than a minor traffic of-
- 3 fense.".

4 SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 5 The amendment made by this Act shall take effect
- 6 on the date of enactment of this Act, but shall not apply
- 7 in the case of any individual who, as of such date of enact-
- 8 ment, holds an enumerator position (whether by appoint-
- 9 ment, assignment, promotion, detail, or other personnel
- 10 action).
