A BILL

To allow an employer to pay an H–2A worker the Federal minimum wage or the prevailing wage in a case where the employer pays either wage to United States citizens similarly employed.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. PAYMENT OF MINIMUM OR PREVAILING WAGE
- 4 TO H-2A WORKERS.
- 5 Section 218(c) of the Immigration and Nationality
- 6 Act (8 U.S.C. 1188(c)) is amended by adding at the end
- 7 the following:

"(5) Payment of minimum or prevailing 1 2 WAGE.—In a case in which an employer pays a 3 qualified United States worker the Federal minimum wage in effect under section 6(a) of the Fair Labor 4 Standards Act of 1938 (29 U.S.C. 206(a)) or the 5 6 prevailing wage in the area of intended employment, the employer shall not be required to pay an H-2A 7 worker similarly employed more than such wage.". 8
