## A BILL

To provide for the issuance of a Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal Stamp.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Great Lakes Restora-
- 5 tion Semipostal Stamp Act of 2010".
- 6 SEC. 2. GREAT LAKES RESTORATION STAMP.
- 7 (a) In General.—In order to afford a convenient
- 8 way for members of the public to contribute to funding
- 9 for the operations supported by the Great Lakes Restora-

1	tion Initiative, as described under the fourth undesignated
2	paragraph under the heading "Administrative Provisions,
3	Environmental Protection Agency" in Public Law 111–88
4	(123 Stat. 2938; commonly known as the "Interior De-
5	partment and Further Continuing Appropriations Act for
6	Fiscal Year 2010"), the United States Postal Service shall
7	issue a semipostal stamp (referred to in this Act as the
8	"Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal Stamp") in accord-
9	ance with the provisions of this section.
10	(b) Cost.—The Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal
11	Stamp shall be offered at a cost equal to the cost of mail-
12	ing a letter weighing 1 ounce or less at the nonautomation
13	single-piece first-ounce letter rate, in effect at the time
14	of purchase, plus a differential of not less than 25 percent.
15	(c) OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The issuance
16	and sale of the Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal
17	Stamp shall be governed by the provisions of section 416
18	of title 39, United States Code, and regulations issued
19	under such section, subject to subsection (b) and the fol-
20	lowing:
21	(1) Disposition of Proceeds.—
22	(A) In general.—All amounts becoming
23	available from the sale of the Great Lakes Res-
24	toration Semipostal Stamp shall be transferred
25	to the Environmental Protection Agency for the

- purpose of funding the operations of the Initiative described in subsection (a), through payments which shall be made at least twice a year.
  - (B) PROCEEDS NOT TO BE OFFSET.—In accordance with section 416(d)(4) of such title 39, amounts becoming available from the sale of the Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal Stamp (as so determined) shall not be taken into account in any decision relating to the level of appropriations or other Federal funding to be furnished in any year to—
  - (i) the Environmental Protection

    Agency; or
    - (ii) the Initiative identified in subsection (a).
    - (2) DURATION.—The Great Lakes Restoration Semipostal Stamp shall be made available to the public for a period of at least 5 years, beginning no later than 12 months after the date of the enactment of this Act.
  - (3) STAMP DEPICTIONS.—Stamps issued under this Act shall depict images of each of the five Great Lakes.

1	(4) Limitation.—The Great Lakes Restoration
2	Semipostal Stamp shall not be subject to, or taken
3	into account for purposes of applying, any limitation
4	under section 416(e)(1)(C) of such title 39.
5	(d) Definition.—For purposes of this Act, the term
6	"semipostal stamp" refers to a stamp described in section
7	416(a)(1) of title 39. United States Code.

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
