A BILL

To repeal specific provisions in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Removing Deals for
- 5 Deficit Reduction Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS IN PPACA.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Effective as of the enactment of
- 8 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the provi-
- 9 sions of such Act specified in subsection (b) are repealed,

- 1 and the provisions of law amended or repealed by the pro-
- 2 visions so specified are restored or revived as if such speci-
- 3 fied provisions had not been enacted.
- 4 (b) Provisions Specified.—The provisions speci-
- 5 field in this subsection are the following provisions within
- 6 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act:
- 7 (1) Section 2006 (relating to special adjustment
- 8 to FMAP determination for certain States recov-
- 9 ering from a major disaster).
- 10 (2) Section 3201(g) (relating to grandfathering
- supplemental benefits for current enrollees after im-
- 12 plementation of competitive bidding).
- 13 (3) Section 10201(e)(1) (relating to DSH allot-
- ment adjustment).
- 15 (4) Section 10323 (relating to Medicare cov-
- 16 erage for individuals exposed to environmental
- health hazards).
- 18 (5) Section 10324 (relating to protections for
- frontier States).
- 20 (6) Section 10502 (relating to infrastructure to
- 21 expand access to care).
- 22 (7) Section 10905(c) (relating to exemption
- from annual fee on health insurance for certain non-
- profit entities).

- 1 (8) Section 10905(d) (relating to certain insur-
- 2 ance exempted from fee).

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
