A BILL

- To amend title 13 of the United States Code to provide for a 5-year term of office for the Director of the Census and to provide for the authority and duties of the Director and Deputy Director of the Census, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Census Oversight Effi-
- 5 ciency and Management Reform Act of 2010".

1	SEC. 2. AUTHORITY AND DUTIES OF DIRECTOR AND DEP-
2	UTY DIRECTOR OF THE CENSUS.
3	(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 21 of the title 13, United
4	States Code, is amended to read as follows:
5	"§21. Director of the Census; Deputy Director of the
6	Census; authority and duties
7	"(a) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section—
8	"(1) 'Director' means the Director of the Cen-
9	sus;
10	"(2) 'Deputy Director' means the Deputy Di-
11	rector of the Census; and
12	"(3) 'function' includes any duty, obligation,
13	power, authority, responsibility, right, privilege, ac-
14	tivity, or program.
15	"(b) Director of the Census.—
16	"(1) Appointment.—
17	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Bureau shall be
18	headed by a Director of the Census, appointed
19	by the President, by and with the advice and
20	consent of the Senate.
21	"(B) QUALIFICATIONS.—Such appoint-
22	ment shall be made from individuals who have
23	a demonstrated ability in management and ex-
24	perience in the collection, analysis, and use of
25	statistical data.
26	"(2) GENERAL AUTHORITY AND DUTIES.—

1	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The Director shall re-
2	port directly to the Secretary without being re-
3	quired to report through any other official of
4	the Department of Commerce.
5	"(B) DUTIES.—The Director shall perform
6	such duties as may be imposed upon the Direc-
7	tor by law, regulations, or orders of the Sec-
8	retary.
9	"(C) INDEPENDENCE OF DIRECTOR.—No
10	officer or agency of the United States shall
11	have any authority to require the Director to
12	submit legislative recommendations, or testi-
13	mony, or comments for review prior to the sub-
14	mission of such recommendations, testimony, or
15	comments to Congress if such recommenda-
16	tions, testimony, or comments to Congress in-
17	clude a statement indicating that the views ex-
18	pressed therein are those of the Bureau and do
19	not necessarily represent the views of the Presi-
20	dent.
21	"(3) TERM OF OFFICE.—
22	"(A) IN GENERAL.—The term of office of
23	the Director shall be 5 years, and shall begin on

the Director shall be 5 years, and shall begin on January 1, 2012, and every fifth year there-

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after. An individual may not serve more than 2 full terms as Director.

"(B) VACANCIES.—Any individual 3 ap-4 pointed to fill a vacancy in such position, occur-5 ring before the expiration of the term for which 6 such individual's predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of that 7 term. The Director may serve after the end of 8 9 the Director's term until reappointed or until a 10 successor has been appointed, but in no event 11 longer than 1 year after the end of such term.

"(C) REMOVAL.—An individual serving as
Director may be removed from office by the
President. The President shall communicate in
writing the reasons for any such removal to
both Houses of Congress not later than 30 days
before the removal.

18 "(4) FUNCTIONS.—The Director shall be re19 sponsible for the exercise of all powers and the dis20 charge of all duties of the Bureau, and shall have
21 authority and control over all personnel and activi22 ties thereof.

23 "(5) ORGANIZATION.—The Director may estab24 lish, alter, consolidate, or discontinue such organiza25 tional units or components within the Bureau as the

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Director considers necessary or appropriate, except
 that this paragraph shall not apply with respect to
 any unit or component provided for by law.

4 "(6) ADVISORY COMMITTEES.—The Director
5 may establish advisory committees to provide advice
6 with respect to any function of the Director. Mem7 bers of any such committee shall serve without com8 pensation, but shall be entitled to transportation ex9 penses and per diem in lieu of subsistence in accord10 ance with section 5703 of title 5.

"(7) REGULATIONS.—The Director may, in
consultation with the Secretary, prescribe such rules
and regulations as the Director considers necessary
or appropriate to carry out the functions of the Director.

"(8) Delegations, etc.—The Director may 16 17 assign duties, and delegate, or authorize successive 18 redelegations of, authority to act and to render deci-19 sions, to such officers and employees of the Bureau 20 as the Director may find necessary. Within the limi-21 tations of such assignments, delegations, or redele-22 gations, all official acts and decisions of such officers 23 and employees shall have the same force and effect 24 as though performed or rendered by the Director. 25 An assignment, delegation, or redelegation under this paragraph may not take effect before the date
 on which notice of such assignment, delegation, or
 redelegation (as the case may be) is published in the
 Federal Register.

"(9) BUDGET REQUESTS.—At the time the Di-5 6 rector submits a budget request to the Secretary for inclusion in the President's budget request for a fis-7 8 cal year submitted under section 1105 of title 31, 9 and prior to the submission of the Department of 10 Commerce budget to the Office of Management and 11 Budget, the Director shall provide that budget infor-12 mation to the Committee on Oversight and Govern-13 ment Reform of the House of Representatives and 14 the Committee on Governmental Affairs of the Sen-15 ate, as well as the Committees on Appropriations of 16 the House of Representatives and the Senate. All 17 other budget requests from the Bureau to the Sec-18 retary shall be made available to the Committees on 19 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and 20 the Senate.

21 "(10) OTHER AUTHORITIES.—

"(A) PERSONNEL.—Subject to sections 23
and 24, but notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Director, in carrying out the
functions of the Director or the Bureau, may

1	use the services of officers and other personnel
2	in other Federal agencies, including personnel
3	of the Armed Forces, with the consent of the
4	head of the agency concerned.
5	"(B) VOLUNTARY SERVICES.—Notwith-
6	standing section 1342 of title 31, or any other
7	provision of law, the Director may accept and
8	use voluntary and uncompensated services.
9	"(c) Deputy Director.—
10	"(1) IN GENERAL.—There shall be in the Bu-
11	reau a Deputy Director of the Census, who shall be
12	appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Direc-
13	tor. The position of Deputy Director shall be a ca-
14	reer reserved position within the meaning of section
15	3132(a)(8) of title 5.
16	"(2) FUNCTIONS.—The Deputy Director shall
17	perform such functions as the Director shall des-
18	ignate.
19	"(3) TEMPORARY AUTHORITY TO PERFORM
20	FUNCTIONS OF DIRECTOR.—The provisions of sec-
21	tions 3345 through 3349d of title 5 shall apply with
22	respect to the office of Director. The first assistant
23	to the office of Director is the Deputy Director for
24	purposes of applying such provisions.".
25	(b) Transition Rules.—

1	(1) Appointment of initial director.—The
2	initial Director of the Bureau of the Census shall be
3	appointed in accordance with the provisions of sec-
4	tion 21(b) of title 13, United States Code, as
5	amended by subsection (a).
6	(2) INTERIM ROLE OF CURRENT DIRECTOR OF
7	THE CENSUS AFTER DATE OF ENACTMENT.—If, as
8	of January 1, 2012, the initial Director of the Bu-
9	reau of the Census has not taken office, the officer
10	serving on December 31, 2011, as Director of the
11	Census (or Acting Director of the Census, if applica-
12	ble) in the Department of Commerce—
13	(A) shall serve as the Director of the Bu-
14	reau of the Census;
15	(B) shall assume the powers and duties of
16	such Director, until the initial Director has
17	taken office; and
18	(C) shall report directly to the Secretary of
19	Commerce.
20	(c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The item relating to
21	section 21 in the table of sections for chapter 1 of title
22	13, United States Code, is amended to read as follows:
	"21. Director of the Census; Deputy Director of the Census; authority and du- ties.".
23	(d) Technical and Conforming Amendments.—
24	Not later than January 1, 2011, the Secretary of Com-

merce, in consultation with the Director of the Census,
 shall submit to each House of the Congress draft legisla tion containing any technical and conforming amendments
 to title 13, United States Code, and any other provisions
 which may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this
 Act.

7 SEC. 3. INTERNET RESPONSE OPTION.

8 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-9 ment of this Act, the Director of the Census, shall provide 10 a plan to Congress on how the Bureau of the Census will test, develop, and implement an Internet response option 11 for the 2020 Census and the American Community Sur-12 13 vey. The plan shall include a description of how and when feasibility will be tested, the stakeholders to be consulted, 14 15 when and what data will be collected, and how data will be protected. 16

17 SEC. 4. ANNUAL REPORTS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter I of chapter 1 of title
13, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
the following new section:

21 "§ 17. Annual reports

"(a) Not later than the date of the submission of the
President's budget request for a fiscal year under section
1105 of title 31, the Director of the Census shall submit
to the appropriate congressional committees a comprehen-

sive status report on the next decennial census, beginning
 with the 2020 decennial census. Each report shall include
 the following information:

4 "(1) A description of the Bureau's performance
5 goals for each significant decennial operation, in6 cluding the performance measures for each oper7 ation.

8 "(2) An assessment of the risks associated with 9 each significant decennial operation, including the 10 interrelationships between the operations and a de-11 scription of relevant mitigation plans.

"(3) Detailed milestone estimates for each significant decennial operation, including estimated
testing dates, and justification for any changes to
milestone estimates.

"(4) Updated cost estimates for the life cycle of 16 17 the decennial census, including sensitivity analysis 18 and an explanation of significant changes in the as-19 sumptions on which such cost estimates are based. "(5) A detailed description of all contracts over 20 21 \$50,000,000 entered into for each significant decen-22 nial operation, including— "(A) any changes made to the contracts 23

24 from the previous fiscal year;

"(B) justification for the changes; and

1	"(C) actions planned or taken to control
2	growth in such contract costs.
3	"(b) For purposes of this section, the term 'signifi-
4	cant decennial operation' includes any program or infor-
5	mation technology related to—
6	((1) the development of an accurate address
7	list;
8	"(2) data collection, processing, and dissemina-
9	tion;
10	"(3) recruiting and hiring of temporary employ-
11	ees;
12	"(4) marketing, communications, and partner-
13	ships; and
14	"(5) coverage measurement.".
15	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
16	for chapter 1 of title 13, United States Code, is amended
17	by inserting after the item relating to section 16 the fol-
18	lowing new item:
	"17. Annual reports.".
19	(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
20	this section shall apply to budget requests for fiscal years
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21 beginning after September 30, 2010.
