 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

12	"(vi) academic testing services.
13	"(B) Amounts excluded.—The term
14	does not include special school fees for nonaca-
15	demic purposes, including fees for student ac-
16	tivities, athletics, insurance, school uniforms,
17	and nonacademic after-school activities.
18	"(3) Qualified educational institution.—
19	The term 'qualified educational institution' means—
20	"(A) an elementary school or secondary
21	school (as such terms are defined in section
22	9101 of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-
23	cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801), or

1	"(B) any private, parochial, or religious
2	school organized for the purpose of providing el-
3	ementary or secondary education, or both.
4	"(d) Adjustment for Coverdell Savings Ac-
5	COUNT DISTRIBUTIONS.—The amount of qualified edu-
6	cation expenses taken into account under subsection (a)

9	sum of any amounts not includible in gross income under
10	section 530(d)(2) for such taxable year by reason of the
