To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to require the disclosure of the names of individuals who are granted amnesty from criminal prosecution by the Internal Revenue Service.

5	(a) In General.—Chapter 77 of the Internal Reve
6	enue Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end the

12	"Not later than 60 days after the close of each cal-
13	endar year, the Secretary shall publish in the Federal Reg
14	ister the names of individuals who have been granted am-

17	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
18	for such chapter 77 is amended by adding at the end the
19	following new item:
	"Sec. 7529. Disclosure of the names of individuals who are granted amnest; from criminal prosecution by the internal revenue service.".
20	(c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
21	this section shall apply to amnesty granted after the date
22	of the enactment of this Act.

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
