AN ACT

To reauthorize the Marine Turtle Conservation Act of 2004, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Marine Turtle Con-

5 servation Reauthorization Act of 2009".

1	SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO PROVISIONS PREVENTING FUND-
2	ING OF PROJECTS IN THE UNITED STATES.
3	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Marine Turtle Conservation
4	Act of 2004 is amended—
5	(1) in section $2(b)$ (16 U.S.C. $6601(b)$), by
6	striking "in foreign countries";
7	(2) in section 3(2) (16 U.S.C. $6602(2)$)—
8	(A) in the matter preceding subparagraph
9	(A), by striking "in foreign countries"; and
10	(B) in subparagraph (D), by striking "of
11	foreign countries"; and
12	(3) in section 4 (16 U.S.C. 6603)—
13	(A) in subsection $(b)(1)(A)$, by inserting
14	"State or" before "foreign country"; and
15	(B) in subsection (d), by striking "in for-
16	eign countries".
17	(b) STATE DEFINED.—Section 3 of such Act (16
18	U.S.C. 6602) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
19	lowing new paragraph:
20	"(7) STATE.—The term 'State' means each of
21	the several States of the United States, the District
22	of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the
23	Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Com-
24	monwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, any
25	other territory or possession of the United States,
26	and any Indian tribe.".

1 SEC. 3. LIMITATIONS ON EXPENDITURES.

2 Section 5(b) of the Marine Turtle Conservation Act
3 of 2004 (16 U.S.C. 6604(b)) is amended—

4 (1) in paragraph (2), by striking "\$80,000"
5 and inserting "\$150,000"; and

6 (2) by adding at the end the following new7 paragraph:

8 "(3) LIMITATION ON PROJECTS IN THE UNITED 9 STATES.—Not more than 20 percent of the amounts 10 made available from the Fund for any fiscal year 11 may be used for projects relating to the conservation 12 of marine turtles in the United States.".
