Mr. SPACE (for himself and Ms. SHEA-PORTER) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services, and in addition to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Defense to establish a commission on urotrauma.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 3 SECTION 1. COMMISSION ON UROTRAUMA.

4 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—Subject to the availability of 5 appropriations for such purpose, the Secretary of Defense 6 shall establish a commission to be known as the "Commis-7 sion on Urotrauma" (in this section referred to as the 8 "Commission"). (b) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out this section,
 the Secretary of Defense shall consult with the Secretary
 of Veterans Affairs and the Secretary of Health and
 Human Services.

5 (c) DUTIES.—The Commission shall conduct a study
6 on urotrauma among members of the Armed Forces and
7 veterans, including—

8 (1) an analysis of the incidence, duration, mor9 bidity rate, and mortality rate of urotrauma;

10 (2) an analysis of the social and economic costs11 and effects of urotrauma;

12 (3) with respect to the Department of Defense 13 and Department of Veterans Affairs, an evaluation 14 of the facilities, access to private facilities, resources, 15 personnel, and research activities that are related to 16 the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of 17 urotrauma;

(4) an evaluation of programs (including such
biological, behavioral, environmental, and social programs) that improve the prevention or treatment of
urotrauma; and

(5) a long-term plan for the use and organization of the resources of the Federal Government to
improve the prevention and treatment of urotrauma.
(d) MEMBERSHIP.—

1	(1) Appointed members.—In addition to the
2	ex officio members described in paragraph (2), the
3	Committee shall be composed of 19 members as fol-
4	lows:
5	(A) Sixteen members appointed by the Sec-
6	retary of Defense.
7	(B) One member appointed by the Sec-
8	retary of Health and Human Services from
9	among officers or employees of the National In-
10	stitute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney
11	Diseases whose primary interest is in the field
12	of urotrauma.
13	(C) The Chief of the Department of Sur-
14	gery of Walter Reed National Military Medical
15	Center.
16	(D) The Chief Medical Director of the De-
17	partment of Veterans Affairs.
18	(2) Ex officio members.—The nonvoting, ex
19	officio members of the Commission are as follows:
20	(A) The Surgeon General of the Navy.
21	(B) The Surgeon General of the Army.
22	(C) The Surgeon General of the Air Force.
23	(D) The Medical Officer of the Marine
24	Corps.

1	(E) The Director of the National Institutes
2	of Health.
3	(F) The Director of the National Institute
4	of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases.
5	(G) The Director of the Division of Kid-
6	ney, Urologic, and Hematologic Diseases of the
7	National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive
8	Kidney Diseases.
9	(H) The Director of the National Institute
10	of Biomedical Imaging and Bioengineering.
11	(3) QUALIFICATIONS.—In appointing members
12	under paragraph (1)(A), the Secretary of Defense
13	shall appoint individuals with experience related to—
14	(A) studying or researching urotrauma;
15	(B) preventing or treating urotrauma; or
16	(C) suffering from urotrauma.
17	(4) TERM.—Each member shall be appointed
18	for the life of the Commission.
19	(5) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the Commission
20	shall be filled in the manner in which the original
21	appointment was made.
22	(6) PAY.—
23	(A) Except as provided in subparagraph
24	(C), members of the Commission shall serve
25	without pay.

1	(B) Except as provided in subparagraph
2	(C), members of the Commission who are full-
3	time officers or employees of the United States
4	may not receive additional pay, allowances, or
5	benefits by reason of their service on the Com-
6	mission.
7	(C) Each member shall receive travel ex-
8	penses, including per diem in lieu of subsist-
9	ence, in accordance with applicable provisions
10	under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5,
11	United States Code.
12	(7) QUORUM.—A majority of members of the
13	Commission shall constitute a quorum but a lesser
14	number may hold hearings.
15	(8) CHAIRPERSON.—The Secretary of Defense
16	shall designate a member as the chairperson of the
17	Committee.
18	(9) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at
19	the call of the chairperson.
20	(e) Staff.—
21	(1) DIRECTOR.—The Commission shall have a
22	director who shall be appointed by the chairperson.
23	(2) STAFF.—Subject to rules prescribed by the
24	Commission, the chairperson may appoint additional
25	personnel as the chairperson considers appropriate.

1	(3) Applicability of certain civil service
2	LAWS.—The director and staff of the Commission
3	shall be appointed subject to the provisions of title
4	5, United States Code, governing appointments in
5	the competitive service, and shall be paid in accord-
6	ance with the provisions of chapter 51 and sub-
7	chapter III of chapter 53 of that title relating to
8	classification and General Schedule pay rates.
9	(4) EXPERTS AND CONSULTANTS.—Subject to
10	rules prescribed by the Commission, the chairperson
11	may procure temporary and intermittent services
12	under section 3109(b) of title 5, United States Code.
13	(5) STAFF TO FEDERAL AGENCIES.—Upon re-
14	quest of the chairperson, the head of any Federal
15	department or agency may detail, on a reimbursable
16	basis, any of the personnel of that department or
17	agency to the Commission to assist it in carrying out
18	its duties under this section.
19	(f) Powers of Commission.—
20	(1) Hearings and sessions.—The Commis-
21	sion may, for the purpose of carrying out this sec-
22	tion, hold hearings, sit and act at times and places,
23	take testimony, and receive evidence as the Commis-
24	sion considers appropriate. The Commission may ad-

minister oaths or affirmations to witnesses appear ing before it.

3 (2) POWERS OF MEMBERS AND AGENTS.—Any
4 member or agent of the Commission may, if author5 ized by the Commission, take any action which the
6 Commission is authorized to take by this section.

7 (3) OBTAINING OFFICIAL DATA.—The Commis8 sion may secure directly from any department or
9 agency of the United States information necessary
10 to enable it to carry out this section. Upon request
11 of the chairperson of the Commission, the head of
12 that department or agency shall furnish that infor13 mation to the Commission.

(4) MAILS.—The Commission may use the
United States mails in the same manner and under
the same conditions as other departments and agencies of the United States.

18 (5) ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT SERVICES.—
19 Upon the request of the Commission, the Adminis20 trator of General Services shall provide to the Com21 mission, on a reimbursable basis, the administrative
22 support services necessary for the Commission to
23 carry out its responsibilities under this section.

24 (g) REPORTS.—

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(1) INTERIM REPORT.—Not later than one year
 after the date on which the members are appointed
 under subsection (d)(1), the Commission shall sub mit to the appropriate congressional committees an
 interim report on the study conducted under sub section (c).
 (2) FINAL REPORT.—Not later than two years

8 after the date on which the members are appointed 9 under subsection (d)(1), the Commission shall sub-10 mit to the appropriate congressional committees a 11 final report on the study conducted under subsection 12 (c), including any recommendations the Commission 13 considers appropriate to improve the prevention and 14 treatment of urotrauma among members of the 15 Armed Forces and veterans.

(h) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall terminate
on the date that is 60 days after the date on which the
Commission submits the final report under subsection
(g)(2).

20 (i) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

21 (1) The term "appropriate congressional com22 mittees" means—

23 (A) the Committees on Armed Services of24 the House of Representatives and Senate; and

(B) the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of 1 2 the House of Representatives and Senate. (2) The term "urotrauma" means injury to the 3 4 urinary tract (including the kidneys, ureters, urinary 5 bladder, urethra, and female and male genitalia) 6 from a penetrating, blunt, blast, thermal, chemical, 7 or biological cause. (j) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is 8 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section 9
