A BILL

To establish Coltsville National Historical Park in the State of Connecticut, and for other purposes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Coltsville National His-
5	torical Park Act".
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
7	For the purposes of this Act:
8	(1) CITY.—The term "city" means the city of
9	Hartford, Connecticut.
10	(2) Commission.—The term "Commission"
11	means the Coltsville National Historical Park Advi-
12	$sory\ Commission\ established\ by\ subsection\ 6(a).$
13	(3) Historic district.—The term "Historic
14	District" means the Coltsville Historic District.
15	(4) MAP.—The term "map" means the map ti-
16	tled "Coltsville National Historical Park—Proposed
17	Boundary", numbered T25/102087, and dated May
18	11, 2010.
19	(5) Park.—The term "park" means the
20	Coltsville National Historical Park in the State of
21	Connecticut.
22	(6) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
23	the Secretary of the Interior.
24	(7) State.—The term "State" means the State
25	$of\ Connecticut.$

1 SEC. 3. COLTSVILLE NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK.

2	(a) Establishment.—
3	(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2),
4	there is established in the State a unit of the National
5	Park System to be known as the "Coltsville National
6	Historical Park".
7	(2) Conditions for establishment.—The
8	park shall not be established until the date on which
9	the Secretary determines that—
10	(A) the Secretary has acquired by donation
11	sufficient land or an interest in land within the
12	boundary of the park to constitute a manageable
13	unit;
14	(B) the State, city, or private property
15	owner, as appropriate, has entered into a writ-
16	ten agreement with the Secretary to donate at
17	least 10,000 square feet of space in the East Ar-
18	mory which would include facilities for park ad-
19	ministration and visitor services;
20	(C) the Secretary has entered into a written
21	agreement with the State, city, or other public
22	entity, as appropriate, providing that—
23	(i) land owned by the State, city, or
24	other public entity within the Coltsville
25	Historic District shall be managed con-
26	sistent with this section; and

1	(ii) future uses of land within the his-			
2	toric district shall be compatible with the			
3	designation of the park and the city's pres-			
4	ervation ordinance; and			
5	(D) the Secretary has reviewed the financial			
6	resources of the owners of private and publi			
7	property within the boundary of the propose			
8	park to ensure the viability of the park based o			
9	those resources.			
10	(b) Boundaries.—The park shall include and provide			
11	appropriate interpretation and viewing of the following			
12	sites, as generally depicted on the map:			
13	(1) The East Armory.			
14	(2) The Church of the Good Shepherd.			
15	(3) The Caldwell/Colt Memorial Parish House.			
16	(4) Colt Park.			
17	(5) The Potsdam Cottages.			
18	(6) Armsmear.			
19	(7) The James Colt House.			
20	(c) Collections.—The Secretary shall enter into a			
21	written agreement with the State of Connecticut State Li-			
22	brary, Wadsworth Atheneum, and the Colt Trust, or other			
23	public entities, as appropriate, to gain appropriate access			
24	to Colt-related artifacts for the purposes of having items			
25	routinely on display in the East Armory or within the park			

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as determined by the Secretary as a major function of the
   visitor experience.
   SEC. 4. ADMINISTRATION.

        (a) In General.—The Secretary shall administer the
   park in accordance with—

             (1) this Act: and

             (2) the laws generally applicable to units of the

        (b) State and Local Jurisdiction.—Nothing in
14
   this Act enlarges, diminishes, or modifies any authority of
15
   the State, or any political subdivision of the State (includ-
   ing the city)—

             (1) to exercise civil and criminal jurisdiction; or

             (2) to carry out State laws (including regula-
19
        tions) and rules on non-Federal land located within
20
        the boundary of the park.

        (c) Cooperative Agreements.—
22
             (1) In General.—As the Secretary determines
23
        to be appropriate to carry out this Act, the Secretary
24
        may enter into cooperative agreements with the owner
25
        of any property within the Coltsville Historic District
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- or any nationally significant properties within the boundary of the park, under which the Secretary may identify, interpret, restore, rehabilitate, and provide technical assistance for the preservation of the properties.
 - (2) RIGHT OF ACCESS.—A cooperative agreement entered into under paragraph (1) shall provide that the Secretary, acting through the Director of the National Park Service, shall have the right of access at all reasonable times to all public portions of the property covered by the agreement for the purposes of—
 - (A) conducting visitors through the properties; and
 - (B) interpreting the properties for the public.
 - (3) Changes or alterations or alterations shall be made to any properties covered by a cooperative agreement entered into under paragraph (1) unless the Secretary and the other party to the agreement agree to the changes or alterations.
 - (4) Conversion, use, or disposal of a project for purposes contrary to the purposes of this section, as determined by the Secretary,

1	shall entitle the United States to reimbursement in an
2	amount equal to the greater of—
3	(A) the amounts made available to the
4	project by the United States; or
5	(B) the portion of the increased value of the
6	project attributable to the amounts made avail-
7	able under this subsection, as determined at the
8	time of the conversion, use, or disposal.
9	(5) Matching funds.—
10	(A) In general.—As a condition of the re-
11	ceipt of funds under this subsection, the Sec-
12	retary shall require that any Federal funds made
13	available under a cooperative agreement shall be
14	matched on a 1-to-1 basis by non-Federal funds.
15	(B) Form.—With the approval of the Sec-
16	retary, the non-Federal share required under
17	subparagraph (A) may be in the form of donated
18	property, goods, or services from a non-Federal
19	source, fairly valued.
20	(d) Acquisition of Land.—Land or interests in land
21	owned by the State or any political subdivision of the State
22	may be acquired only by donation.
23	(e) Technical Assistance and Public Interpre-
24	TATION.—The Secretary may provide technical assistance

and public interpretation of related historic and cultural resources within the boundary of the historic district. 3 SEC. 5. MANAGEMENT PLAN. 4 (a) In General.—Not later than 3 fiscal years after the date on which funds are made available to carry out this Act, the Secretary, in consultation with the Commission, shall complete a management plan for the park in 8 accordance with— 9 (1) section 12(b) of Public Law 91–383 (com-10 monly known as the National Park Service General 11 Authorities Act) (16 U.S.C. 1a-7(b)); and 12 (2) other applicable laws. 13 (b) Cost Share.—The management plan shall include provisions that identify costs to be shared by the Fed-14 15 eral Government, the State, and the city, and other public or private entities or individuals for necessary capital improvements to, and maintenance and operations of, the 18 park. 19 (c) Submission to Congress.—On completion of the management plan, the Secretary shall submit the manage-20 21 ment plan to— 22 (1) the Committee on Natural Resources of the 23 House of Representatives; and 24 (2) the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-25 sources of the Senate.

1	SEC. 6. COLTSVILLE NATIONAL HISTORICAL PARK ADVI-

3	(a) Establishment.—There is established a Commis-				
4	sion to be known as the Coltsville National Historical Park				
5	Advisory Commission.				
6	(b) Duty.—The Commission shall advise the Secretary				
7	in the development and implementation of the management				
8	plan.				
9	(c) Membership.—				
10	(1) Composition.—The Commission shall be				
11	composed of 11 members, to be appointed by the Sec-				
12	retary, of whom—				
13	(A) 2 members shall be appointed after con-				
14	sideration of recommendations submitted by the				
15	Governor of the State;				
16	(B) 1 member shall be appointed after con-				
17	sideration of recommendations submitted by the				
18	State Senate President;				
19	(C) 1 member shall be appointed after con-				
20	sideration of recommendations submitted by the				
21	Speaker of the State House of Representatives;				
22	(D) 2 members shall be appointed after con-				
23	sideration of recommendations submitted by the				
24	Mayor of Hartford, Connecticut:				

1	(E) 2 members shall be appointed after con-				
2	sideration of recommendations submitted by				
3	Connecticut's 2 United States Senators;				
4	(F) 1 member shall be appointed after con-				
5	sideration of recommendations submitted by				
6	Connecticut's First Congressional District Rep-				
7	resentative;				
8	(G) 2 members shall have experience with				
9	national parks and historic preservation;				
10	(H) all appointments must have significant				
11	experience with and knowledge of the Coltsville				
12	Historic District; and				
13	(I) 1 member of the Commission must live				
14	in the Sheldon/Charter Oak neighborhood within				
15	the Coltsville Historic District.				
16	(2) Initial appointments.—The Secretary shall				
17	appoint the initial members of the Commission not				
18	later than the earlier of—				
19	(A) the date that is 30 days after the date				
20	on which the Secretary has received all of the				
21	recommendations for appointments under para				
22	graph (1); or				
23	(B) the date that is 30 days after the park				
24	$is\ established.$				
25	(d) Term; Vacancies.—				

1	(1) TERM.—
2	(A) In General.—A member shall be ap-
3	pointed for a term of 3 years.
4	(B) Reappointment.—A member may be
5	reappointed for not more than 1 additional
6	term.
7	(2) Vacancies.—A vacancy on the Commission
8	shall be filled in the same manner as the original ap-
9	pointment was made.
10	(e) Meetings.—The Commission shall meet at the call
11	of—
12	(1) the Chairperson; or
13	(2) a majority of the members of the Commis-
14	sion.
15	(f) Quorum.—A majority of the Commission shall
16	constitute a quorum.
17	(g) Chairperson and Vice Chairperson.—
18	(1) In general.—The Commission shall select a
19	Chairperson and Vice Chairperson from among the
20	members of the Commission.
21	(2) Vice Chairperson.—The Vice Chairperson
22	shall serve as Chairperson in the absence of the Chair-
23	person.

1	(3) TERM.—A member may serve as Chairperson
2	or Vice Chairperson for not more than 1 year in each
3	office.
4	(h) Commission Personnel Matters.—
5	(1) Compensation of members.—
6	(A) In General.—Members of the Commis-
7	sion shall serve without compensation.
8	(B) Travel expenses.—Members of the
9	Commission shall be allowed travel expenses, in-
10	cluding per diem in lieu of subsistence, at rates
11	authorized for an employee of an agency under
12	subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United
13	States Code, while away from the home or reg-
14	ular place of business of the member in the per-
15	formance of the duty of the Commission.
16	(2) Staff.—
17	(A) In general.—The Secretary shall pro-
18	vide the Commission with any staff members
19	and technical assistance that the Secretary, after
20	consultation with the Commission, determines to
21	be appropriate to enable the Commission to
22	carry out the duty of the Commission.
23	(B) Detail of employees.—The Sec-
24	retary may accept the services of personnel de-

1 tailed from the State or any political subdivision 2 of the State. 3 (i) FACA NONAPPLICABILITY.—Section 14(b) of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.) shall not 5 apply to the Commission. 6 (j) TERMINATION.— 7 (1) In General.—Unless extended under para-8 graph (2), the Commission shall terminate on the 9 date that is 10 years after the date of the enactment 10 of this Act. 11 (2) Extension.—Eight years after the date of 12 the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall make 13 a recommendation to the Secretary if a body of its 14 nature is still necessary to advise on the development 15 of the park. If, based on a recommendation under this 16 paragraph, the Secretary determines that the Com-17 mission is still necessary, the Secretary may extend 18 the life of the Commission for not more than 10 years. 19 SEC. 7. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATION. 20 There is authorized to be appropriated \$10,000,000 for

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the development of the park.
