A BILL

To provide for congressional approval of national monuments
in Oregon, restrictions on the use of national monu-
ments, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LIMITATION ON FURTHER EXTENSION OR ES-**
4 **TABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL MONUMENTS IN**
5 **OREGON.**

6 The proviso of the last sentence of the first section
7 of the Act of September 14, 1950 (64 Stat. 849, chapter
8 950; 16 U.S.C. 431a), is amended by inserting “or Or-
9 egon” after “Wyoming”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS ON THE EXTENSION OR ESTABLISH-**
2 **MENT OF NATIONAL MONUMENTS.**

3 The Act of June 8, 1906 (16 U.S.C. 431 et seq.) is
4 amended—

5 (1) in section 2 (16 U.S.C. 431), by striking
6 “**SEC. 2.** That the” and inserting the following:

7 **“SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF NATIONAL MONUMENTS.**

8 “After obtaining congressional approval of the pro-
9 posed national monument and certifying compliance with
10 the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C.
11 4321 et seq.) with respect to the proposed national monu-
12 ment, the”; and

13 (2) by adding at the end the following:

14 **“SEC. 5. RESTRICTIONS ON PUBLIC USE.**

15 “The Secretary of the Interior shall not implement
16 any restrictions on the public use of a national monument
17 until the expiration of an appropriate review period (as
18 determined by the Secretary of the Interior) providing for
19 public input and congressional approval.”.
