- 3 SECTION 1. SENSE OF CONGRESS.
- 4 It is the sense of Congress that—
- 5 (1) the Federal Pell Grant program under sec-
- 6 tion 401 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
- 7 U.S.C. 1070a) is the single largest source of grant
- 8 aid for postsecondary education attendance funded
- 9 by the Federal Government;

1	(2) the Federal Pell Grant program plays a
2	unique role in promoting economic and social mobil-
3	ity in the United States;
4	(3) the Federal Pell Grant program is the Na-
5	tion's largest single source of need-based grant as-
6	sistance;
7	(4) financial aid has a significant positive im-
8	pact on the postsecondary enrollment and success
9	rates of students from low income families; and
10	(5) the Federal Pell Grant Program should be
11	a high funding priority.
