## A BILL

To provide for a visitor center for visitors to Yosemite National Park, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK VISITORS CENTER.
- 4 (a) Acquisition of Lands and Interests in
- 5 Lands.—The Secretary of the Interior may acquire not
- 6 more than 18 acres of lands and interests in lands, from
- 7 willing sellers only, outside the boundaries of Yosemite
- 8 National Park near the junction of highways CA-49 and
- 9 CA-140 in the community of Mariposa, California, to pro-

1	vide a site or sites for visitor services and administrative
2	purposes.
3	(b) Permanent Improvements for Visitor Serv-
4	ICES AND ADMINISTRATIVE FACILITIES.—
5	(1) In general.—The Secretary may use Fed-
6	eral and other available funds for the design, con-
7	struction, management, and maintenance of perma-
8	nent improvements to provide visitor services and
9	administrative facilities on lands and interests in
10	lands acquired under subsection (a).
11	(2) Planning.—When planning permanent im-
12	provements under paragraph (1), the Secretary
13	may—
14	(A) partner with Mariposa County on land
15	use planning related to the lands and interests
16	in lands acquired under subsection (a); and
17	(B) consider the feasibility of allowing the
18	State of California to locate the California
19	State Mining and Mineral Museum on the lands
20	and interests in lands acquired under sub-
21	section (a).
