## A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to enter into an interagency agreement with the Corporation for National and Community Service to support a Nutrition Corps.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Service for Healthier
- 5 Kids Act".

#### SEC. 2. INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT TO PROMOTE NUTRI-2 TION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS. 3 (a) Interagency Agreement.— 4 (1) Secretary of Agriculture.— 5 (A) IN GENERAL.—From the amounts ap-6 propriated under subsection (c), the Secretary 7 of Agriculture may enter into an interagency 8 accordance agreement, in with section 9 192A(g)(10) of the National and Community 10 Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12651b(g)(10)), 11 with the Corporation for National and Commu-12 nity Service to support a Nutrition Corps to 13 carry out the national service programs described in subsection (b) by providing services 14 15 that— 16 (i) increase access to, and participa-17 tion in, the nutrition assistance programs 18 administered by the Secretary of Agri-19 culture; 20 (ii) improve the quality of the nutri-21 tion assistance programs; and 22 support local agriculture and 23 farm to school initiatives undertaken by 24 the Secretary of Agriculture. 25 NUTRITION CORPS ASSISTANCE.— (B) 26 From the amounts appropriated under sub-

12	participants serving in the Nutrition Corps who

15	Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12501 et seq.)
16	or the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973
17	(42 U.S.C. 4950 et seq.).
18	(2) Corporation for national and commu-
19	NITY SERVICE.—The Corporation, in entering into
20	the interagency agreement under paragraph (1)
21	shall approve, in accordance with section
22	192A(g)(10) of the National and Community Service
23	Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12651b(g)(10)), positions
24	for the national service programs carried out by the

1	Nutrition Corps as approved national service posi-
2	tions.
3	(b) Nutrition Corps.—
4	(1) NATIONAL SERVICE PROGRAMS.—The na-
5	tional service programs carried out by the Nutrition
6	Corps shall—
7	(A) address unmet health needs within
8	communities by providing services that—
9	(i) improve access to, and increase
10	participation in, the nutrition assistance
11	programs administered by the Secretary of
12	Agriculture;
13	(ii) improve the quality of the nutri-
14	tion assistance programs; and
15	(iii) support local agriculture and
16	farm-to-school initiatives undertaken by
17	the Secretary of Agriculture; and
18	(B) comply with the nonduplication and
19	nondisplacement requirements of section 177 of
20	the National and Community Service Act (42
21	U.S.C. 12637).
22	(2) Services authorized to be provided.—
23	The services provided by the national service pro-
24	grams under paragraph (1) may include—

- 1 (A) helping expand in-classroom breakfast 2 under the school breakfast program authorized 3 under section 4 of the Child Nutrition Act of 4 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1773) by assisting with set up 5 and clean up; 6 (B) expanding access to the summer food
  - (B) expanding access to the summer food service program authorized under section 13 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1761) by assisting with activities for children, transporting and preparing food, and conducting outreach to recruit sponsors and participants;
  - (C) helping educate and train program providers for the nutrition assistance programs, which may include assisting home providers under the child and adult care food program authorized under section 17 of the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1786) in promoting healthy food choices and physical activity among children;
  - (D) helping clinics participating in the special supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children authorized under section 17 of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42)

2	clinics;
3	(E) conducting community needs assess-
4	ments in support of efforts to reduce obesity,
5	promote healthy eating, and end childhood hun-
6	$\operatorname{ger};$
7	(F) helping promote local agriculture and
8	farm-to-school initiatives undertaken by the
9	Secretary of Agriculture; and
10	(G) coordinating and convening community
11	stakeholders to cross-promote nutrition pro-
12	grams and lead related planning processes.
13	(c) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
14	are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-
15	essary to carry out this section for fiscal year 2011 and
16	each of fiscal years 2012 through 2015.
