## AN ACT

To amend the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 to prohibit any person from performing lobbying activities on behalf of a client which is determined by the Secretary of State to be a State sponsor of terrorism.

PROHIBITING LOBBYING ACTIVITIES ON BE-2 HALF OF STATE SPONSORS OF TERRORISM. 3 The Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1601) et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following 4 5 new section: 6 "SEC. 27. PROHIBITING LOBBYING ACTIVITIES ON BEHALF 7 OF STATE SPONSORS OF TERRORISM. 8 "No person may perform lobbying activities on behalf of a client which is a country the government of which the Secretary of State has determined, for purposes of sec-10 tion 6(j) of the Export Administration Act of 1979 (as 11 continued in effect pursuant to the International Emer-12 gency Economic Powers Act), section 40 of the Arms Ex-13 port Control Act, section 620A of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, or any other provision of law, is a government that has repeatedly provided support for acts of international terrorism.". 17
