AN ACT

To amend the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 to prohibit
any person from performing lobbying activities on behalf
of a client which is determined by the Secretary of State
to be a State sponsor of terrorism.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITING LOBBYING ACTIVITIES ON BE-**
2 **HALF OF STATE SPONSORS OF TERRORISM.**

3 The Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C. 1601
4 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following
5 new section:

6 **“SEC. 27. PROHIBITING LOBBYING ACTIVITIES ON BEHALF**
7 **OF STATE SPONSORS OF TERRORISM.**

8 “No person may perform lobbying activities on behalf
9 of a client which is a country the government of which
10 the Secretary of State has determined, for purposes of sec-
11 tion 6(j) of the Export Administration Act of 1979 (as
12 continued in effect pursuant to the International Emer-
13 gency Economic Powers Act), section 40 of the Arms Ex-
14 port Control Act, section 620A of the Foreign Assistance
15 Act of 1961, or any other provision of law, is a government
16 that has repeatedly provided support for acts of inter-
17 national terrorism.”.
