A BILL

To amend the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act to require the use of sums received as fines, penalties, and forfeitures of property for violations of that Act or other marine resource laws to be used to reduce the Federal deficit and debt.

1	SECTION 1. USE OF FINES, PENALTIES, AND FORFEITURES
2	OF PROPERTY FOR VIOLATIONS OF MARINE
3	RESOURCE LAWS TO REDUCE THE FEDERAL
4	DEFICIT AND DEBT.
5	Section 311(e)(1) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery
6	Conservation and Management Act (16 U.S.C. 1861(e))
7	is amended to read as follows:
8	"(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of
9	law, sums received as fines, penalties, and forfeitures
10	of property for violations of any provisions of this
11	Act or of any other marine resource law enforced by
12	the Secretary, including the Lacey Act Amendments
13	of 1981 (16 U.S.C. 3371 et seq.) shall be deposited
14	into the Treasury and applied—
15	"(A) to reduce the annual Federal budget
16	deficit for the fiscal year in which the sums are
17	received, except as provided in subparagraph
18	(B); and
19	"(B) if there is no annual Federal budget
20	deficit for such fiscal year, to reduce the out-
21	standing Federal debt.".
