## **AN ACT**

- To review, update, and revise the factors to measure the severity, magnitude, and impact of a disaster and to evaluate the need for assistance to individuals and households.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Multi-State Disaster3 Relief Act".

## **4** SEC. 2. INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE FACTORS.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—In order to provide more objective criteria for evaluating the need for assistance to individ-6 7 uals and households and to speed a declaration of a major 8 disaster or emergency under the Robert T. Stafford Dis-9 aster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 10 5121 et seq.), not later than one year after the date of 11 enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Federal 12 Emergency Management Agency (referred to in this Act as the "Administrator"), in cooperation with representa-13 tives of State and local emergency management agencies, 14 shall review, update, and revise through rulemaking the 15 factors considered under section 206.48(b) of title 44, 16 Code of Federal Regulations, to measure the severity, 17 18 magnitude, and impact of a disaster.

(b) CONSIDERATION OF A CONTIGUOUS COUNTY.—
In reviewing, updating, and revising the factors referenced
in subsection (a) the Administrator shall include as a factor whether a contiguous county in an adjacent state has
been designated in a major disaster or emergency as a
result of the same incident.

25 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 months after the date
26 of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall submit
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to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure
 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
 Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the Sen ate a report on the Federal Emergency Management
 Agency's current regulations, policies, procedures, and
 practices on—

7 (1) recommending major disaster or emergency
8 declarations in order to provide assistance to individ9 uals and households; and

10 (2) making post-declaration designations of the 11 need for assistance to individuals and households in 12 a county that is contiguous to a State that has re-13 ceived a major disaster or emergency declaration for 14 the same incident.
